NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises and in conformity with said Revised Statutes of the United States, HAS GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DOES GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Stauffer Chemical Company and to its successors and assigns, the said premises above described, as Survey No. 6685 with the exclusive right of possession and enjoyment of all the land included within the exterior lines of said survey;

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said mill site or premises, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of what-soever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Stauffer Chemical Company and to its successors and assigns forever, subject, nevertheless, to the following conditions and stipulations:

FIRST. That the premises hereby conveyed shall be held subject to any vested and accrued water rights for mining, agricultural, manufacturing, or other purposes, and rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may be recognized and acknowledged by the local customs, laws, and decisions of courts; and there is reserved from the lands hereby granted, a right of way thereon for ditches or canals constructed by the authority of the United States.

SECOND. That in the absence of necessary legislation by Congress, the Legislature of California may provide rules for working the premises hereby granted, involving easements, drainage, and other necessary means to the complete development thereof.
