SUBJECT: Amending Fiscal Year 2011-2012 CAO-Accumulated Capital Outlay budget, Water System Trust budget, and Water Department budget

DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend your Board:

1. Amend the Water Department budget (budget unit 024102) by increasing appropriations in Operating Transfer Out (object code 5801) by \$211,885, Office Space & Site Rental (object code 5291) by \$51,351, and Prior Years Reimbursements (object code 5499) by \$51,351. (4/5th vote required);
2. Amend the CAO – Accumulated Capital Outlay budget (budget unit 010201) by increasing revenue in Charges for Services (revenue code 4825) by \$51,351, and Prior Year Revenue (revenue code 4901) by \$51,351. (4/5th vote required); and,
3. Amend the Water Systems Trust budget (budget unit 501505) by increasing revenue in Operating Transfers In (revenue code 4998) by \$211,885, and increasing appropriations in Prior Years Reimbursements (object code 5499) by \$211,885. (4/5th vote required).

SUMMARY DISCUSSION:

For several years, the City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power has maintained that the Independence Town Water System and Lone Pine Town Water System have exceeded the specified annual water allotment amounts that LADWP is required to provide free of cost or charge pursuant to the provisions of the Long Term Water Agreement and Town Water Transfer Agreements. As indicated in the attached September 30, 2011, letter from Gene Coufal to Doug Wilson, the amount LADWP alleges it is owed through Fiscal Year 2009-2010 is \$211,885. While the County disagrees with LADWP's calculations, it is fiscally advantageous and appropriate to budget and provide spending authority for this potentiality as this time. Each year LADWP provides the County with an annual payment that, under the provisions of the Long Term Water Agreement, is only to be used for purposes of operation and maintenance of water and environmentally related activities. This annual funding is placed in trust, in the Water Projects Fund, and used primarily to fund Water Department activities. However, it is also appropriate to consider using these funds for the purpose of paying costs associated with operating the town water systems.

When the Water Department office was moved from Bishop to Independence in 2008, the department's budget had started to routinely require consideration of General Fund Operating Transfers as part of the Board of Supervisors' adoption of the County Budget in order to address structural budget deficits and cash flow issues. In a presentation to the Board of Supervisors, the then-Director of the Water department projected that the size of the department's structural budget deficit and cash flow needs would increase in subsequent years. Rent costs were identified as one of the departmental costs that could help reverse this trend, and the opportunity to

reduce or eliminate rent costs was cited by the County Administrative Officer as one of several compelling reasons to move the department's office to Independence. Accordingly, to increase the department's Water Projects Fund Balance, subsequent CAO Recommended Budgets have not charged the department rent for its Independence office space. Now that the department's structural budget deficit has been eliminated, and the Water Projects Fund Balance has grown significantly over the past three fiscal years (from \$133,385.02 as of June 30, 2008, to \$958,755 as of June 30, 2011), it now seems appropriate and advantageous to both the Water department and the County to begin charging the department rent for its County office space. This is consistent with the County's practice of charging other Non-General Fund budgets rent.

The Water department occupies 5,349 square feet in the former Inyo County Office of Education building in Independence. At the time it vacated the May Street building in Bishop, staff reported that the department was paying 91.36-cents per square foot in lease expense for 5,659 square feet of space (the current lease cost is 98.39-cents per square foot and expected to increase 3% in the coming year). In March, a presentation regarding the proposed Consolidated County Office Building project estimated the County's current three-year average lease expense for office space is 85.30-cents per square foot. Accordingly, it seems reasonable to charge the Water department 80-cents a square foot for lease space. Given that the department's Water Projects Fund Balance reached a healthy \$750,446.98 as of June 30, 2010, it also seems reasonable that the department be charged rent retroactive to Fiscal Year 2010-2011. Rather than have this rent be accrued to the benefit of the County General Fund, where it would be used for on-going operating expenses, it is recommended that the Water department's rent payments accrue in the CAO-Accumulated Capital Outlay budget, which is a Non-General Fund budget, for one-time acquisition and improvement projects. In this way, revenue derived from a County capital asset will be used to fund improvement to other capital assets.

Section XIV.C of the Long Term Water Agreement reads in part:

Annual funding shall be placed in trust by the County and shall be used only for purposes of operation and maintenance of water and environmentally related activities. If at anytime [sic] one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00) or more is accumulated in the trust, the Department shall not be required to make an additional annual payment until the funds in the trust are less than eight hundred twenty thousand five hundred and eighty dollars (\$820,580.00) as of June 30th of any year.

The fiscal well-being of the Water department's Water Projects Fund has now been restored to a point of vigor where all of the provisions of this section of the Long Term Water Agreement need to be monitored and considered, and could be amplified if the recommended budget amendments are not approved by your Board.

ALTERNATIVES:

Your Board could elect not to approve the recommended amendments to the County Budget. This, however, is strongly discouraged since it could result in the department's Water Projects Fund Balance being higher than desirable to ensure timely annual payments from LADWP and would result in some of the County's funding needs for the operation and maintenance of water and environmentally related activities remaining unmet.


OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

FINANCING:


There is sufficient Fund Balance in the Water Projects Fund to pay for these water related activities.

Subject: Town Water Use Annual Allotments

Laws, the Place

Provisions of the Long Term Water Agreement and the Town Water Transfer Agreements (TWTA) require the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) to provide a specified annual water amount to the towns of Laws, Independence, and Lone Pine free of cost or charge. These amounts are 50 acre-feet for Laws, 450 acre-feet for Independence, and 550 acre-feet for Lone Pine.

For 2010-11 the town of Laws used 18 acre-feet, Independence used 449 acre-feet, and the town of Lone Pine used 547 acre-feet. Enclosed are Well Field Pump Production Reports for Fiscal Year 2010-2011 for the Laws, Independence-Oak, and Lone Pine areas.

There was 793 acre-feet pumped from the Lone Pine water system, but 246 acre-feet was pumped from well W346 directly to the Los Angeles Aqueduct as payback for water previously supplied to Diaz Lake.

Past letters dated April 15, 2005, March 2, 2006, January 3, 2007, September 11, 2007, December 12, 2008, December 3, 2009, and October 21, 2010 included previous detailed costs owed.

DEPARTMENTAL RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend Board approve of the following agreements for public defender services:

1. Agreement Between County of Inyo And Jim Reilly For The Provision Of Professional Services As A Public Defender [Misdemeanors – North County] for the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2014, in an amount not to exceed \$252,000 pending appropriate signatures and adoption of future County Budgets and authorize the Chair to sign; and,
2. Agreement Between County of Inyo And Mark A. Johnson For The Provision Of Professional Services As A Public Defender [Felonies] for the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2015, in an amount not to exceed \$426,000 pending appropriate signatures and adoption of future County Budgets and authorize the Chair to sign.
3. Agreement Between County of Inyo And Elizabeth Corpora For The Provision Of Professional Services As A Public Defender [Welfare and Institutions, Family Support, and Juvenile Court] for the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2015, in an amount not to exceed \$339,000 pending appropriate signatures and adoption of future County Budgets and authorize the Chair to sign.
4. Agreement Between County of Inyo And Paul DeQuattro For The Provision Of Professional Services As A Public Defender [Misdemeanors – South County & Second Coverage Welfare and Institutions, Family Support, and Juvenile Court] for the period August 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013, with an option to extend the terms of the agreement from July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2015, in an amount not to exceed \$340,833.26 pending appropriate signatures and adoption of future County Budgets and authorize the Chair to sign.

SUMMARY DISCUSSION:

The County is required to provide Public Defender services for the indigent, and currently does so through independent contracts with qualified attorneys. If the County fails to provide adequate Public Defender services, or conflicts exist between the County's Contract Public Defenders, the Court may appoint other attorneys ("Non-Contract" or "Out-of-Contract" Public Defenders) to provide indigent legal services. Attorneys appointed by the Court as Out-of-Contract Public Defenders are entitled to charge the County at a rate set without input or control by the County.

The County's current contract for the provision of public defender services for all felony cases in Inyo County will expire June 30, 2012. Additionally, the contractor awarded the Welfare and Institutions, Family Support, and Juvenile Court public defender services agreement October 1, 2010, terminated his contract three months early, effective July 1, 2012. And, the North County Misdemeanor contract for public defender services was terminated nine-months early by the contractor, and has been vacant since April 1, 2012.

The County immediately undertook a comprehensive recruitment effort for public defender services – including contacting local attorneys, and advertising in a variety of publications and websites – since learning of the North County Misdemeanors public defender's decision to terminate his contract (and in anticipation of the expiration of the felony contract). However, the recruitment process has taken longer than would be preferred to attract qualified candidates, and the County has had to pay Non-Contract attorneys to carry the North County Misdemeanor caseload since May 1, 2012.

To ensure the provision of adequate Public Defender services, and in an effort to minimize potential conflicts (and provide coverage when conflicts exist), the County's Public Defender contracts are generally structured to divide Public Defender services between the juvenile and the adult courts, and each Public Defender is assigned primary and secondary responsibilities; usually with priorities for conflict coverage assigned within each responsibility area. For example, one contractor might have primary responsibility for felony appointments (first priority), misdemeanors – North County (second priority), misdemeanors – South County (third priority) with secondary obligations for all other conflict matters including dependency, delinquency, mental health, and child support cases, as well as advocating for patients' rights. In this manner, the County is able to ensure reasonable coverage for legal representation that the County is required to provide before the various courts for qualified indigent persons. Working with County Counsel, the public defender contracts and associated scopes of work for the agreements presented for your Board's consideration today have been revised and tightened-up to clarify primary and secondary responsibilities, and provide the Court's with greater flexibility in addressing potential conflicts to help defray out-of-contract payment orders.

The agreements for public defender services being presented for your Board's approval represent an effort to reduce the number of County public defender contracts from five to four, while more equally distributing the caseload between the Contract-Attorneys. While it may prove necessary to recommend a fifth, part-time public defender contract to your Board in the future, the contracts being presented today also represent an opportunity to cap, and in most cases slightly reduce the cost of the County's contract public defender costs when compared to the contracts they are replacing. The terms will also provide cost-certainty into the future – for the next three years for three of the agreements, and two years for the fourth agreement – again, at the same or lower costs as the contracts they are replacing. For example:

- Approving the agreement with Mr. Johnson will result in a three-year agreement for Felony public defender services at an annual cost of \$138,000, \$144,000 and \$144,000 respectively compared to the \$147,112 the previous contractor made in the final year of her contract.
- Approving the agreement with Ms. Corpora will result in a three-year agreement for Welfare and Institutions, Family Support, and Juvenile Court public defender services at an annual cost of \$113,000 compared to the \$116,000 the previous contractor would have been entitled to in the final year of his contract had he not terminated it.
- Approving the agreement with Mr. DeQuattro will result in a one year agreement, with an option for another two years, for South County Misdemeanor public defender services, as well as eliminating the need for separate secondary Welfare and Institutions, Family Support, and Juvenile Court contract, at a cost of \$100,833.26 for the 11 months, and (\$120,000 a year for the following two years if the option is

extended) compared to the \$120,000 a year identified in the current South County Misdemeanors contract it is replacing.

- Approving the agreement with Mr. Reilly will result in a two-year agreement for North County Misdemeanor public defender services at an annual cost of \$126,000 compared to the \$127,500 the previous contractor was entitled to in the final year of his contract.

Approving the agreements with Mr. Reilly and Mr. Johnson will result in terminating their current contracts (the current Welfare and Institutions, Family Support, and Juvenile Court contract, and South County Misdemeanor contract, respectively) eight months and 18-months early.

ALTERNATIVES:


Your Board could choose not to approve any or all of the contracts, however, (assuming they have been signed by the contractors) this is not advised – the contracts are fair and will satisfy to the County’s obligation to provide indigent legal services more efficiently and cost-effectively than paying for out-of-contract legal services.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The assistance of County Counsel and the Superior Court were invaluable in reviewing applications and filling the contracts.

FINANCING:



**AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF INYO
AND JIM REILLY
FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER**

INTRODUCTION

WHEREAS, the County of Inyo (hereinafter referred to as "County") requires professional services for the purpose of providing legal representation before the various courts, for certain qualified indigent persons who fall within any of the following classifications:

1. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on felony charges (hereinafter referred to as "Felony cases") except those cases where the result may be a sentence of life without parole;
2. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on misdemeanor charges (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor cases");
3. Minors brought before the Juvenile Court of Inyo County for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 601 and 602 (hereinafter referred to as "Delinquency cases");
4. Minors and/or parents brought before the Superior Court of Inyo County and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 (hereinafter referred to as "Dependency cases");
5. Persons ordered to show cause before the Superior Court of Inyo County re contempt for alleged failure to pay child support or before said court in proceedings to establish paternity and support (hereinafter referred to as "Child Support cases");
6. Persons involuntarily detained by Inyo County for treatment and evaluation pursuant to sections 5150 and 5170 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, or for prolonged subsequent detention pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 5250, 5260, 5300, 5304 or 6500; or proposed L.P.S. Conservatees and L.P.S. Conservatees brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal pursuant to sections 5350 or 5352.1 of the Welfare and Institutions Code; or persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for post adjudication of criminal mental health status preceding under Penal Code 1026 et. seq.; Children in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7861); or indigent parents in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7860); or indigent non-custodial parents in proceedings to terminate the parent's rights for willful failure to communicate and support (Family Code section 7860); or conservatees, proposed conservatees, or persons alleged to lack legal capacity or unable to retain legal counsel and requesting the appointment of counsel in proceedings to establish a conservatorship or appoint a proposed conservator, terminate conservatorship, remove the conservator, or obtain an order authorizing removal of a temporary conservatee from the temporary conservatee's place of residence (Probate Code section 1471), [hereinafter all referred to as "Mental Health cases"];

7. Patients for whom the Contractor is appointed the patients rights advocate pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5520, by the Inyo County Mental Health Director (hereinafter referred to as "Patient Rights Advocate Cases");
8. Persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court for determinations and commitments under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 6600 et seq. (hereinafter referred to as "Sexually Violent Predator cases");
9. Persons taking misdemeanor criminal appeals from the Inyo County Superior Court to the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of Inyo County (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor Appeal cases"); and
10. Persons requiring Public Defender representation under the provisions of AB 109.

WHEREAS, the County has by contract divided performance of the required professional services described above, between independent contractors engaged to perform public defender services for the County. The purpose of said contracts for public defender services is to provide competent and effective legal representation to qualified indigent persons appearing before the various courts and to minimize the expenditure of County funds for the payment of private attorneys appearing as public defenders, pro tempore, in cases where the other contract public defenders are unable to appear due to attorney-client and/or time conflicts of interest.

WHEREAS, the County has the need for JIM REILLY of BISHOP, CALIFORNIA (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor") to provide professional legal services as a Public Defender for Inyo County (North and South).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, terms, and conditions hereinafter set forth, the County and Contractor agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. SCOPE OF WORK.

The Contractor shall furnish to the County, upon its request, all of those services and work set forth in the Scope of Work, Attachment A, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. Requests by the County to the Contractor to perform under this Agreement will be made by the judges of the Superior Court of Inyo County. Requests to the Contractor for work or services to be performed under this Agreement, will be based upon the County's need for such services. The County makes no guarantee or warranty, of any nature, as to the level or amount of services or work which will be requested or required of the Contractor by the County under this Agreement. County by this Agreement incurs no obligation or requirement to compensate Contractor, over and above that provided for in this Agreement, for the performance of any services or work required to be performed by Contractor under this Agreement.

Services and work provided by the Contractor at the County's request under this Agreement will be performed in a manner consistent with the requirements and standards established by applicable federal, state, and County laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions. Such laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions include, but are not limited to, those which are referred to in this Agreement.

2. TERM.

A. Initial Term and Options.

The initial term of this Agreement is for a two (2) year period from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2014.

3. CONSIDERATION.

A. Compensation. County shall pay Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein, for the performance of the services and work described in Attachment A.

B. Travel and Per Diem. Contractor will not be paid or reimbursed travel expenses or per diem for any in-county travel performed by Contractor in providing services and work under this Agreement. County shall reimburse Contractor for Court authorized out-of-county travel expenses and per diem which Contractor incurs in providing work and services under this Agreement. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any out-of-County travel expenses or per diem, receive written authorization for Contractor to travel out-of-county on the case from the assigned judge. Properly authorized out-of-county travel and per diem expenses will be reimbursed in the same amount and to the same extent as County reimburses its permanent status employees for such expenses. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for out-of-county travel or per diem expenses which are either in excess of the amounts that may be paid to County's permanent status employees, or which are incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned judge.

C. Incidental Expenses. County shall reimburse Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, for those incidental expenses which are specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees and which are necessarily incurred by the Contractor in providing the services and work under this Agreement. Reimbursement by County for such incidental expenses will be limited to Contractor's actual cost without regard to any administrative or overhead expenses incurred by Contractor in obtaining or utilizing such incidental services or supplies. Reimbursement for actual costs will not exceed the amounts set forth in the Schedule of Fees.

D. No additional consideration. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, Contractor shall not be entitled to, nor receive, from County, any additional consideration, compensation, salary, wages, or other type of remuneration for any public defender services provided either under the terms of this Agreement or as may be requested or appointed by the Superior Court of California in and for the County of Inyo ("out of contract" appointments) without prior written approval by the County Administrative Officer ("CAO"). In addition, Contractor shall not, by virtue of this Agreement, to consideration in the form of overtime, health insurance benefits, retirement benefits, disability retirement benefits, sick leave, vacation time, paid holidays, or other paid leaves of absence of any type or kind whatsoever.

E. Limit upon amount payable under Agreement. The total sum of all compensation payments made by the County to Contractor under this Agreement, including incidental, travel and per diem expenses, if any, shall not exceed \$ n/a Dollars (hereinafter referred to as "contract limit"). County expressly reserves the right to deny any payment or reimbursement to Contractor which is in excess of the contract limit.

F. Billing and payment. County shall pay to Contractor the monthly payments set forth in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, without any billing or statement from Contractor. Within 30 days of Contractor incurring any authorized incidental, travel, or per diem expenses, Contractor shall submit a statement to the County. The statement will itemize each incidental, travel, or per diem expense and identify the date and case in which the expense was incurred. The statement will include a conformed copy of the court authorization for travel and/or incidental expenses and receipts for lodging, meals, and other incidental expenses in accordance with the County's accounting procedures and rules. County will make payment to Contractor for all authorized reimbursable expenses for which a statement is properly submitted, within 30 days of the County's receipt of such statement.

G. Federal and State taxes.

(1) Except as provided in subparagraph (2) below, County will not withhold any federal or state income taxes or social security from any payments made by County to Contractor under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

(2) County will withhold California State income taxes from payments made under this Agreement to non-California resident independent contractors when it is anticipated that total annual payments to Contractor under this Agreement will exceed one thousand four hundred ninety nine dollars (\$1,499.00).

(3) Except as set forth above, County has no obligation to withhold any taxes or payments from sums paid by County to Contractor under this Agreement. Payment of all taxes and other assessments on such sums is the sole responsibility of Contractor. County has no responsibility or liability for payment of Contractor's taxes or assessments.

(4) The total amounts paid by County to Contractor, and taxes withheld from payments to non-California residents, if any, will be reported annually to the Internal Revenue Service and the California State Franchise Tax Board.

4. WORK SCHEDULE.

Contractor's obligation is to perform, in a timely manner, those services and work identified in Attachment A. It is understood by Contractor that the performance of these services and work will require a varied schedule. Contractor will arrange his/her own schedule, but will coordinate with the courts of Inyo County, other Inyo County Contract Public Defenders, other counsel, and parties, as necessary, to insure that all services and work under this Agreement will be performed in a timely manner.

5. REQUIRED LICENSES, CERTIFICATES, AND PERMITS.

A. Any licenses, certificates, or permits required by the federal, state, county, or municipal governments, for Contractor to provide the services and work described in Attachment A must be procured by Contractor and be valid at the time Contractor enters into this Agreement. Further, during the term of this Agreement Contractor must maintain such licenses, certificates, and permits in full force and effect. Licenses, certificates, and permits may include, but are not limited to, driver's license, professional licenses or certificates, and business licenses. Such licenses, certificates, and permits will be procured and maintained in force by Contractor at no expense to the County. Contractor will provide County, upon execution of this Agreement, with evidence of current and valid licenses, certificates and permits which are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A. Where there is a dispute between Contractor and County as to what licenses, certificates, and permits are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A, County reserves the right to make such determinations for purposes of this Agreement.

B. Contractor warrants that it is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in covered transactions by any federal department or agency. Contractor also warrants that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal funds as listed in the List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Non-procurement Programs issued by the General Services Administration available at: <http://www.epls.gov>.

6. COUNTY PROVIDED SERVICES AND SUPPLIES.

County will provide Contractor with those services and supplies which are specifically identified in the Schedule of County Provided Services and Supplies, Attachment C, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. County incurs no obligation or requirement to reimburse or compensate Contractor if he/she for any reason either does not use the County provided services and supplies, or procures similar services and supplies from other sources.

7. COUNTY PROPERTY.

Any personal property such as, but not limited to, protective or safety devices, badges, identification cards, keys, etc., provided to Contractor by County pursuant to this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of County. Contractor will use reasonable care to protect, safeguard and maintain such items while they are in Contractor's possession. Contractor will be financially responsible for any loss or damage to such items, partial or total, which is the result of Contractor's negligence.

8. PRODUCTS OF CONTRACTOR'S WORK AND SERVICES.

Any and all compositions, publications, plans, designs, specifications, blueprints, maps, formulas, processes, photographs, slides, video tapes, computer programs, computer disks, computer tapes, memory chips, soundtracks, audio recordings, films, audio-visual presentations, exhibits, reports, studies, works of art, inventions, patents, trademarks, copyrights, or intellectual properties of any kind which are created, produced, assembled, compiled by, or are the result, product, or manifestation of, Contractor's services or work under this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of the Contractor.

9. OFFICE SPACE, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, ETC.

Except for the County Provided Services and Supplies provided for in Section 6 above, Contractor shall provide all such office space, supplies, equipment, vehicles, reference materials and books, postage, letterhead, stationery, secretarial services, receptionist services, legal assistant services, telephone services, duplicating services, and case storage facilities as are necessary to provide the work and services required of Contractor by this Agreement. Except for those incidental expenses specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, County is not obligated to reimburse or pay Contractor for any expense or cost incurred by Contractor in procuring or maintaining such items or services. Responsibility for the costs and expenses incurred by Contractor in providing and maintaining items or services not specifically set forth in the Schedule of Fees (Attachment B) as Incidental Expenses, is the sole responsibility and obligation of Contractor.

10. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

Contractor shall provide statutory California Worker's Compensation coverage and Employer's Liability coverage for not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for all employees engaged in services or operations under this Agreement. The County of Inyo, its agents, officers and employees shall be named as additional insured or a waiver of subrogation shall be provided.

11. INSURANCE.

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder and the results of that work by the Contractor, his agents, representatives or employees.

A. Minimum Scope of Insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001).
2. Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, code 1 (any auto).

3. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.

B. Minimum Limits of Insurance. Contractor shall maintain limits no less than:

1. General Liability (including operations, products and completed operations as applicable): \$100,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
2. Automobile Liability: \$300,000.00 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
3. Employer's Liability: \$500,000.00 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
4. Errors and Omissions Liability: \$500,000.00 per occurrence.

C. Deductibles and Self-insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. At the option of the County, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers; or the Contractor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the County guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses.

D. Other Insurance Provisions. The commercial general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. The County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance, or as a separate owner's policy (CG 20 10 11 85).
2. For any claims related to this project, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
3. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the County.
4. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code.

E. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII. The County at its option may waive this requirement.

F. Verification of Coverage. Contractor shall furnish the County with original certificates and amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. The endorsements should be on forms provided by the County or on other than the County's forms, provided those endorsements or policies conform to the requirements. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified

copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements effecting the coverage required by the specifications at any time.

12. STATUS OF CONTRACTOR.

All acts of Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees, relating to the performance of this Agreement, shall be performed as independent contractors, and not as agents, officers, or employees of County. Contractor, by virtue of this Agreement, has no authority to bind or incur any obligation on behalf of County. Except as expressly provided in Attachment A, Contractor has no authority or responsibility to exercise any rights or power vested in the County. No agent, officer, or employee of the County is to be considered an employee of Contractor. It is understood by both Contractor and County that this Agreement shall not under any circumstances be construed or considered to create an employer-employee relationship or a joint venture. As an independent contractor:

A. Contractor shall determine the method, details, and means of performing the work and services to be provided by Contractor under this Agreement.

B. Contractor shall be responsible to County only for the requirements and results specified in this Agreement, and except as expressly provided in this Agreement, shall not be subjected to County's control with respect to the physical action or activities of Contractor in fulfillment of this Agreement.

C. Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees are, and at all times during the term of this Agreement shall, represent and conduct themselves as independent contractors, and not as employees of County.

13. DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION.

Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless County, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, resulting from, or in connection with, the performance of this Agreement by Contractor, or Contractor's agents, officers, or employees. Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless applies to any actual or alleged personal injury, death, or damage or destruction to tangible or intangible property, including the loss of use. Contractor's obligation under this paragraph extends to any claim, damage, loss, liability, expense, or other cost which is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, his/her agents, employees, supplier, or any one directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts or omissions any of them may be liable.

Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless under the provisions of this paragraph is not limited to, or restricted by, any requirement in this Agreement for Contractor to procure and maintain a policy of insurance.

To the extent permitted by law, County shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, or resulting from, the active negligence, or wrongful acts of County, its officers, or employees.

14. RECORDS AND AUDIT.

A. Records. Contractor shall prepare and maintain all records required by the various provisions of this Agreement, federal, state, county, municipal, ordinances, regulations, and directions. Contractor shall maintain these records for a minimum of four (4) years from the termination or completion of this Agreement. Contractor may fulfill its obligation to maintain records as required by this paragraph by substitute photographs, microphotographs, or other authentic reproduction of such records.

B. Inspections and Audits. Any authorized representative of County shall have access to any books, documents, papers, records, including, but not limited to, financial records of Contractor, which are not otherwise legally privileged information, and which County determines to be pertinent to this Agreement, for the purposes of making audit, evaluation, examination, excerpts, and transcripts during the period such records are to be maintained by Contractor. Further, County has the right, at all reasonable times, to audit, inspect, or otherwise evaluate the work performed or being performed under this Agreement.

C. Workload Data. Contractor shall promptly provide to County any and all workload or case data, which is not otherwise legally privileged information, upon the written request of either the County Administrator or the County Board of Supervisors.

15. NONDISCRIMINATION.

During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees shall not unlawfully discriminate in violation of any federal, state, or local law, against any employee, or applicant for employment, or person receiving services under this Agreement, because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, age, or sex. Contractor and his/her agents, officers, and employees shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code section 12900, et seq.), and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder in the California Code of Regulations. Contractor shall also abide by the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) and all amendments thereto, and all administrative rules and regulations issued pursuant to said act.

16. CANCELLATION.

This Agreement may be canceled by County without cause, and at will, for any reason by giving to Contractor sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel. Contractor may cancel this Agreement without cause, and at will, for any reason whatsoever by giving sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel to County.

17. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

Upon the termination of this Agreement or any extension thereof, County shall pay Contractor such compensation due, if any, prorated to the date of termination; and Contractor shall deliver all active and inactive case files to the person or office as the County Administrator shall designate in writing.

18. TERMINATION OF PREVIOUS AGREEMENT.

Contractor agrees that upon the execution of this Agreement by the parties hereto, any prior written Agreement for the provision of professional services as a Public Defender for the County of Inyo shall be terminated, and the consideration for the continued representation of clients in the courts of the County of Inyo shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement as of the effective date of this Agreement. It is further understood between the parties hereto that there are no oral agreements or representations between the parties affecting this Agreement and that this Agreement supersedes and cancels any and all previous negotiations, arrangements, agreements and understandings, if any, and none thereof shall be used to interpret or construe this Agreement.

19. ASSIGNMENT.

This is an agreement for the services of Contractor. County has relied upon the skills, knowledge, experience, and training of Contractor as an inducement to enter into this Agreement. Contractor shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement, or any part of it, without the express written consent of County. Further, Contractor shall not assign any monies due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County.

20. DEFAULT.

If the Contractor abandons the work, or fails to proceed with the work and services requested by County in a timely manner, or fails in any way as required to conduct the work and services as required by County, County may declare the Contractor in default and terminate this Agreement upon five (5) days written notice to Contractor.

21. WAIVER OF DEFAULT.

Waiver of any default by either party to this Agreement shall not be deemed to be waiver of any subsequent default. Waiver or breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach, and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of this Agreement unless this Agreement is modified as provided in paragraph twenty-eight (28) below.

22. CONFIDENTIALITY.

Contractor agrees to comply with the various provisions of the federal, state, and county laws, regulations, and ordinances providing that information and records kept, maintained, or accessible by Contractor in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, shall be privileged, restricted, or confidential. Contractor agrees to keep confidential all such information and records. Disclosure of such confidential, privileged, or protected information shall be made by Contractor only in compliance with law..

23. CONFLICTS.

Contractor agrees that he/she has no interest, and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with Contractor's performance of the work and services under this Agreement. Specifically, Contractor agrees not to engage in any private legal representations of any matter which would conflict or interfere with Contractor's ability to represent clients under this Agreement. Additionally, Contractor, during the term of this Agreement agrees not to advise or represent any person , corporation or entity with a claim or cause of action against the County of Inyo, its officers, agents, or employees.

24. POST AGREEMENT COVENANT.

Contractor agrees not to use any confidential, protected, or privileged information which is gained in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, for any personal benefit, gain, or enhancement.

25. SEVERABILITY.

If any portion of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, or if it is found in contravention of any federal, state, or county statute, ordinance, or regulation, the remaining provisions of this Agreement, or the application thereof, shall not be invalidated thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

26. FUNDING LIMITATION.

The ability of County to enter this Agreement is based upon available funding from various sources. In the event that such funding fails, is reduced, or is modified, from one or more sources, County has the option to cancel, reduce, or modify this Agreement, or any of its terms within ten (10) days of its notifying Contractor of the cancellation, reduction, or modification of available funding. Any reduction or modification of this Agreement made pursuant to this provision must comply with the requirements of paragraph twenty-eight (28) (Amendment).

27. ATTORNEY'S FEES.

If either of the parties hereto brings an action or proceeding against the other, including, but not limited to, an action to enforce or declare the cancellation, termination, or revision of the Agreement, the prevailing party in such action or proceeding shall be entitled to receive from the other party all reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred in connection therewith.

28. RENEGOTIATION.

Either the County or the Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days written notice, initiate renegotiation of the Scope of Work (Attachment A and A-1) and Schedule of Fees (Attachment B). If as a result of renegotiations, both parties agree to modify the Scope of Work and Schedule of Fees, such modification must comply with the requirements of paragraph twenty-nine (29) (Amendment).

29. AMENDMENT.

This Agreement may be modified, amended, changed, added to, or subtracted from, by the mutual consent of the parties hereto, if such amendment or change is in written form and executed with the same formalities as this Agreement, and attached to the original Agreement to maintain continuity.

30. NOTICE.

Any notice, communication, amendments, additions, or deletions to this Agreement, including change of address of either party during the terms of this Agreement, which Contractor or County shall be required, or may desire, to make, shall be in writing and may be personally served, or sent by prepaid first class mail to, the respective parties as follows:

31. ENTIRE AGREEMENT.

This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties, and no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements otherwise between the parties not embodied herein or incorporated herein by reference, shall be of any force or effect. Further, no term or provision hereof may be changed, waived, discharged, or terminated, unless the same be in writing executed by the parties hereto.

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**AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF INYO
AND JIM REILLY
FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER**

SCOPE OF WORK:

1. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES.

A. WARRANTY. Contractor warrants that he/she has read and reviewed the contracts of all the other attorneys engaged by the County to provide professional services as public defenders (hereinafter referred to as "Contract Public Defenders") during the term of this Agreement. Such Agreements are by reference incorporated herein as though set forth in full. Contractor agrees and understands that he/she shall consult, confer, and agree with all the other Contract Public Defenders to, and shall provide legal representation and substitute handling and coverage of Contract Public Defender cases as required by the provisions below. Contractor agrees and understands that these provisions are of mutual benefit to Contractor and each of the other Contract Public Defenders, and does not entitle Contractor to any additional compensation under this Agreement.

B. DEFINITIONS.

1. "Attorney-Conflict of Interest" cases are those that would be within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender but for an attorney-client conflict of interest of that public defender. Attorney-client conflicts are those that are defined and recognized by applicable law.

2. "Time Conflict" cases are those that are within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender who is unable to fulfill his/her contractual duties to attend the courts and represent the clients in such cases for whatever reason including, but not limited to vacations, temporary illnesses, conflicting court calendars, or attendance at attorney education courses.

C. ATTORNEY-CLIENT CONFLICT OF INTEREST CASES. Except as may be provided in F. below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement, attached hereto and by referenced incorporated herein.

D. TIME CONFLICT CASES. Except as may be provided in E and F below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement.

E. TIME CONFLICT CASES LIMITATION. Contractor shall provide coverage for time conflict cases for which another Contract Public Defender is primarily responsible but for whatever reason, the duties of such other Contract Public Defender cannot be performed for a period of not more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days.

F. **WAIVER.** The requirements for Contractor to handle attorney-client conflict of interest and time conflict cases as required by this Agreement may be waived by the County Administrator where extenuating demands are placed upon Contractor during his/her representation of the following:

1. A defendant charged with a capital or other serious offense in which the death penalty or life imprisonment without possibility of parole is a possible sanction;
2. A minor, who, if charged and tried as an adult, may face the death penalty or life imprisonment without the possibility of parole;
3. A minor or parent(s) on a Writ arising out of a dependency case in which the Contractor represents such minor or parent(s).

CONFLICTS COVERAGE TABLE:

During the period of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases, and substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases as required by this Agreement, in the following types of cases and in the following priority among other Contract Public Defenders:

Primary Obligations:

First Priority	Misdemeanors, North County
First Priority	Sexually Violent Predator Cases
Second Priority:	Misdemeanors, South County
Third Priority:	Felony Cases, North and South County

Secondary Obligations:

All other Conflict matters, including Delinquency, Dependency, Child Support, Mental Health and Conservatorship Cases, Patient Rights Advocate Cases, AB 109 Revocation Hearings and any other matter in which the County is obligated to provide public defender services.

Note: The Table listed above will be followed for the majority of the cases assigned to this Public Defender. However, a Judge, when assigning a case, will consider the experience, caseload, complexity of the case and prior representation of the same client, which may result in a Public Defender assigned a case out of the listed sequence. In addition, the County reserves the right to modify the conflicts coverage table as necessary to make consistent with other Public Defender contracts as they may be amended and as necessary to address legislative changes which may impact the County's obligation to provide Public Defender services.

SCHEDULE OF FEES:

1. COMPENSATION:

County shall pay to Contractor on or before the first (1st) day of each month during the term of the Agreement, the amount set forth below as full and complete compensation for Contractor's performance of all of the work and services required to be performed during that month by Contractor:

A. From July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2014: \$126,000.00 Annual; \$10,500/mo.

2. INCIDENTAL EXPENSES:

A. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provision of Sections 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized professional services required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person which Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Professional services shall include, but not be limited to, investigators, photographers, accident reconstruction experts, chemists, criminalists, psychologists, psychiatrists, physicians, and other legal counsel with specialized expertise. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for professional services, received written authorization for Contractor to engage the providers of specific professional services from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve engaging each provider of professional services as well as the amount of any fees, costs, and other expenses for such services. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for the expenses of professional services which are either in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge.

B. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provisions of Section 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized document photocopying which is in excess of 5,000 pages in any single case, and which is required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person whom Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for reimbursable photocopying, provide documentation to the County that Contractor has at his/her own expense made 5,000 copies of documents in a single case, and received written authorization for Contractor to incur reimbursable photocopying expenses from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve incurring expenses for photocopies in excess of 5,000 pages, shall set forth the number of additional pages authorized to be copied, and the authorized cost of such copying. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for copying expenses which are in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge, or which were incurred by the Contractor in making the first 5,000 photocopy pages in any single case.

1. County will set up a Centrix phone line in Contractor's office for Contractor's use in providing the services and work required under this Agreement. County will pay the reasonable cost of installing this phone line in Contractor's Office. However, Contractor will pay the monthly cost of this phone line plus the cost of any calls or other services billed to this line.
2. County will provide Contractor with reasonable access to County's copying facilities for duplicating documents, and FAX facilities for transmitting documents necessary to perform the work and services required under this Agreement. Contractor will promptly pay to County the County's actual cost of providing such copying and FAX services and facilities to Contractor.
3. County will provide to Contractor confidential storage for closed case files.
4. If Contractor is eligible for group health insurance coverage under the County's group health insurance plan or program, Contractor will have the option to purchase group health insurance coverage under such plan or program at Contractor's sole and entire cost, and at no cost or obligation to the County.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF INYO
AND MARK A. JOHNSON
FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER**

INTRODUCTION

WHEREAS, the County of Inyo (hereinafter referred to as "County") requires professional services for the purpose of providing legal representation before the various courts, for certain qualified indigent persons who fall within any of the following classifications:

1. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on felony charges (hereinafter referred to as "Felony cases") except those cases where the result may be a sentence of life without parole;
2. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on misdemeanor charges (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor cases");
3. Minors brought before the Juvenile Court of Inyo County for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 601 and 602 (hereinafter referred to as "Delinquency cases");
4. Minors and/or parents brought before the Superior Court of Inyo County and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 (hereinafter referred to as "Dependency cases");
5. Persons ordered to show cause before the Superior Court of Inyo County re contempt for alleged failure to pay child support or before said court in proceedings to establish paternity and support (hereinafter referred to as "Child Support cases");
6. Persons involuntarily detained by Inyo County for treatment and evaluation pursuant to sections 5150 and 5170 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, or for prolonged subsequent detention pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 5250, 5260, 5300, 5304 or 6500; or proposed L.P.S. Conservatees and L.P.S. Conservatees brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal pursuant to sections 5350 or 5352.1 of the Welfare and Institutions Code; or persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for post adjudication of criminal mental health status preceding under Penal Code 1026 et. seq.; Children in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7861); or indigent parents in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7860); or indigent non-custodial parents in proceedings to terminate the parent's rights for willful failure to communicate and support (Family Code section 7860); or conservatees, proposed conservatees, or persons alleged to lack legal capacity or unable to retain legal counsel and requesting the appointment of counsel in proceedings to establish a conservatorship or appoint a proposed conservator, terminate conservatorship, remove the conservator, or obtain an order authorizing removal of a temporary conservatee from the temporary conservatee's place of residence (Probate Code section 1471), [hereinafter all referred to as "Mental Health cases"];

7. Patients for whom the Contractor is appointed the patients rights advocate pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5520, by the Inyo County Mental Health Director (hereinafter referred to as "Patient Rights Advocate Cases");
8. Persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court for determinations and commitments under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 6600 et seq. (hereinafter referred to as "Sexually Violent Predator cases");
9. Persons taking misdemeanor criminal appeals from the Inyo County Superior Court to the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of Inyo County (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor Appeal cases"); and
10. Persons requiring Public Defender representation under the provisions of AB 109.

WHEREAS, the County has by contract divided performance of the required professional services described above, between independent contractors engaged to perform public defender services for the County. The purpose of said contracts for public defender services is to provide competent and effective legal representation to qualified indigent persons appearing before the various courts and to minimize the expenditure of County funds for the payment of private attorneys appearing as public defenders, pro tempore, in cases where the other contract public defenders are unable to appear due to attorney-client and/or time conflicts of interest.

WHEREAS, the County has the need for MARK A. JOHNSON of BISHOP, CALIFORNIA (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor") to provide professional legal services as a Public Defender for Inyo County (North and South).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, terms, and conditions hereinafter set forth, the County and Contractor agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. SCOPE OF WORK.

The Contractor shall furnish to the County, upon its request, all of those services and work set forth in the Scope of Work, Attachment A, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. Requests by the County to the Contractor to perform under this Agreement will be made by the judges of the Superior Court of Inyo County. Requests to the Contractor for work or services to be performed under this Agreement, will be based upon the County's need for such services. The County makes no guarantee or warranty, of any nature, as to the level or amount of services or work which will be requested or required of the Contractor by the County under this Agreement. County by this Agreement incurs no obligation or requirement to compensate Contractor, over and above that provided for in this Agreement, for the performance of any services or work required to be performed by Contractor under this Agreement.

Services and work provided by the Contractor at the County's request under this Agreement will be performed in a manner consistent with the requirements and standards established by applicable federal, state, and County laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions. Such laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions include, but are not limited to, those which are referred to in this Agreement.

2. TERM.

A. Initial Term and Options.

The initial term of this Agreement is for a three (3) year period from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2015.

3. CONSIDERATION.

A. Compensation. County shall pay Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein, for the performance of the services and work described in Attachment A.

B. Travel and Per Diem. Contractor will not be paid or reimbursed travel expenses or per diem for any in-county travel performed by Contractor in providing services and work under this Agreement. County shall reimburse Contractor for Court authorized out-of-county travel expenses and per diem which Contractor incurs in providing work and services under this Agreement. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any out-of-County travel expenses or per diem, receive written authorization for Contractor to travel out-of-county on the case from the assigned judge. Properly authorized out-of-county travel and per diem expenses will be reimbursed in the same amount and to the same extent as County reimburses its permanent status employees for such expenses. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for out-of-county travel or per diem expenses which are either in excess of the amounts that may be paid to County's permanent status employees, or which are incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned judge.

C. Incidental Expenses. County shall reimburse Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, for those incidental expenses which are specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees and which are necessarily incurred by the Contractor in providing the services and work under this Agreement. Reimbursement by County for such incidental expenses will be limited to Contractor's actual cost without regard to any administrative or overhead expenses incurred by Contractor in obtaining or utilizing such incidental services or supplies. Reimbursement for actual costs will not exceed the amounts set forth in the Schedule of Fees.

D. No additional consideration. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, Contractor shall not be entitled to, nor receive, from County, any additional consideration, compensation, salary, wages, or other type of remuneration for any public defender services provided either under the terms of this Agreement or as may be requested or appointed by the Superior Court of California in and for the County of Inyo ("out of contract" appointments) without prior written approval by the County Administrative Officer ("CAO"). In addition, Contractor shall not, by virtue of this Agreement, to consideration in the form of overtime, health insurance benefits, retirement benefits, disability retirement benefits, sick leave, vacation time, paid holidays, or other paid leaves of absence of any type or kind whatsoever.

E. Limit upon amount payable under Agreement. The total sum of all compensation payments made by the County to Contractor under this Agreement, including incidental, travel and per diem expenses, if any, shall not exceed \$ n/a Dollars (hereinafter referred to as "contract limit"). County expressly reserves the right to deny any payment or reimbursement to Contractor which is in excess of the contract limit.

F. Billing and payment. County shall pay to Contractor the monthly payments set forth in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, without any billing or statement from Contractor. Within 30 days of Contractor incurring any authorized incidental, travel, or per diem expenses, Contractor shall submit a statement to the County. The statement will itemize each incidental, travel, or per diem expense and identify the date and case in which the expense was incurred. The statement will include a conformed copy of the court authorization for travel and/or incidental expenses and receipts for lodging, meals, and other incidental expenses in accordance with the County's accounting procedures and rules. County will make payment to Contractor for all authorized reimbursable expenses for which a statement is properly submitted, within 30 days of the County's receipt of such statement.

G. Federal and State taxes.

(1) Except as provided in subparagraph (2) below, County will not withhold any federal or state income taxes or social security from any payments made by County to Contractor under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

(2) County will withhold California State income taxes from payments made under this Agreement to non-California resident independent contractors when it is anticipated that total annual payments to Contractor under this Agreement will exceed one thousand four hundred ninety nine dollars (\$1,499.00).

(3) Except as set forth above, County has no obligation to withhold any taxes or payments from sums paid by County to Contractor under this Agreement. Payment of all taxes and other assessments on such sums is the sole responsibility of Contractor. County has no responsibility or liability for payment of Contractor's taxes or assessments.

(4) The total amounts paid by County to Contractor, and taxes withheld from payments to non-California residents, if any, will be reported annually to the Internal Revenue Service and the California State Franchise Tax Board.

4. WORK SCHEDULE.

Contractor's obligation is to perform, in a timely manner, those services and work identified in Attachment A. It is understood by Contractor that the performance of these services and work will require a varied schedule. Contractor will arrange his/her own schedule, but will coordinate with the courts of Inyo County, other Inyo County Contract Public Defenders, other counsel, and parties, as necessary, to insure that all services and work under this Agreement will be performed in a timely manner.

5. REQUIRED LICENSES, CERTIFICATES, AND PERMITS.

A. Any licenses, certificates, or permits required by the federal, state, county, or municipal governments, for Contractor to provide the services and work described in Attachment A must be procured by Contractor and be valid at the time Contractor enters into this Agreement. Further, during the term of this Agreement Contractor must maintain such licenses, certificates, and permits in full force and effect. Licenses, certificates, and permits may include, but are not limited to, driver's license, professional licenses or certificates, and business licenses. Such licenses, certificates, and permits will be procured and maintained in force by Contractor at no expense to the County. Contractor will provide County, upon execution of this Agreement, with evidence of current and valid licenses, certificates and permits which are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A. Where there is a dispute between Contractor and County as to what licenses, certificates, and permits are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A, County reserves the right to make such determinations for purposes of this Agreement.

B. Contractor warrants that it is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in covered transactions by any federal department or agency. Contractor also warrants that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal funds as listed in the List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Non-procurement Programs issued by the General Services Administration available at: <http://www.epls.gov>.

6. COUNTY PROVIDED SERVICES AND SUPPLIES.

County will provide Contractor with those services and supplies which are specifically identified in the Schedule of County Provided Services and Supplies, Attachment C, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. County incurs no obligation or requirement to reimburse or compensate Contractor if he/she for any reason either does not use the County provided services and supplies, or procures similar services and supplies from other sources.

7. COUNTY PROPERTY.

Any personal property such as, but not limited to, protective or safety devices, badges, identification cards, keys, etc., provided to Contractor by County pursuant to this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of County. Contractor will use reasonable care to protect, safeguard and maintain such items while they are in Contractor's possession. Contractor will be financially responsible for any loss or damage to such items, partial or total, which is the result of Contractor's negligence.

8. PRODUCTS OF CONTRACTOR'S WORK AND SERVICES.

Any and all compositions, publications, plans, designs, specifications, blueprints, maps, formulas, processes, photographs, slides, video tapes, computer programs, computer disks, computer tapes, memory chips, soundtracks, audio recordings, films, audio-visual presentations, exhibits, reports, studies, works of art, inventions, patents, trademarks, copyrights, or intellectual properties of any kind which are created, produced, assembled, compiled by, or are the result, product, or manifestation of, Contractor's services or work under this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of the Contractor.

9. OFFICE SPACE, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, ETC.

Except for the County Provided Services and Supplies provided for in Section 6 above, Contractor shall provide all such office space, supplies, equipment, vehicles, reference materials and books, postage, letterhead, stationery, secretarial services, receptionist services, legal assistant services, telephone services, duplicating services, and case storage facilities as are necessary to provide the work and services required of Contractor by this Agreement. Except for those incidental expenses specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, County is not obligated to reimburse or pay Contractor for any expense or cost incurred by Contractor in procuring or maintaining such items or services. Responsibility for the costs and expenses incurred by Contractor in providing and maintaining items or services not specifically set forth in the Schedule of Fees (Attachment B) as Incidental Expenses, is the sole responsibility and obligation of Contractor.

10. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

Contractor shall provide statutory California Worker's Compensation coverage and Employer's Liability coverage for not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for all employees engaged in services or operations under this Agreement. The County of Inyo, its agents, officers and employees shall be named as additional insured or a waiver of subrogation shall be provided.

11. INSURANCE.

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder and the results of that work by the Contractor, his agents, representatives or employees.

A. Minimum Scope of Insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001).
2. Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, code 1 (any auto).

3. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.

B. Minimum Limits of Insurance. Contractor shall maintain limits no less than:

1. General Liability (including operations, products and completed operations as applicable): \$100,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
2. Automobile Liability: \$300,000.00 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
3. Employer's Liability: \$500,000.00 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
4. Errors and Omissions Liability: \$500,000.00 per occurrence.

C. Deductibles and Self-insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. At the option of the County, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers; or the Contractor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the County guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses.

D. Other Insurance Provisions. The commercial general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. The County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance, or as a separate owner's policy (CG 20 10 11 85).
2. For any claims related to this project, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
3. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the County.
4. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code.

E. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII. The County at its option may waive this requirement.

F. Verification of Coverage. Contractor shall furnish the County with original certificates and amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. The endorsements should be on forms provided by the County or on other than the County's forms, provided those endorsements or policies conform to the requirements. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified

copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements effecting the coverage required by the specifications at any time.

12. STATUS OF CONTRACTOR.

All acts of Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees, relating to the performance of this Agreement, shall be performed as independent contractors, and not as agents, officers, or employees of County. Contractor, by virtue of this Agreement, has no authority to bind or incur any obligation on behalf of County. Except as expressly provided in Attachment A, Contractor has no authority or responsibility to exercise any rights or power vested in the County. No agent, officer, or employee of the County is to be considered an employee of Contractor. It is understood by both Contractor and County that this Agreement shall not under any circumstances be construed or considered to create an employer-employee relationship or a joint venture. As an independent contractor:

A. Contractor shall determine the method, details, and means of performing the work and services to be provided by Contractor under this Agreement.

B. Contractor shall be responsible to County only for the requirements and results specified in this Agreement, and except as expressly provided in this Agreement, shall not be subjected to County's control with respect to the physical action or activities of Contractor in fulfillment of this Agreement.

C. Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees are, and at all times during the term of this Agreement shall, represent and conduct themselves as independent contractors, and not as employees of County.

13. DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION.

Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless County, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, resulting from, or in connection with, the performance of this Agreement by Contractor, or Contractor's agents, officers, or employees. Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless applies to any actual or alleged personal injury, death, or damage or destruction to tangible or intangible property, including the loss of use. Contractor's obligation under this paragraph extends to any claim, damage, loss, liability, expense, or other cost which is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, his/her agents, employees, supplier, or any one directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts or omissions any of them may be liable.

Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless under the provisions of this paragraph is not limited to, or restricted by, any requirement in this Agreement for Contractor to procure and maintain a policy of insurance.

To the extent permitted by law, County shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, or resulting from, the active negligence, or wrongful acts of County, its officers, or employees.

14. RECORDS AND AUDIT.

A. Records. Contractor shall prepare and maintain all records required by the various provisions of this Agreement, federal, state, county, municipal, ordinances, regulations, and directions. Contractor shall maintain these records for a minimum of four (4) years from the termination or completion of this Agreement. Contractor may fulfill its obligation to maintain records as required by this paragraph by substitute photographs, microphotographs, or other authentic reproduction of such records.

B. Inspections and Audits. Any authorized representative of County shall have access to any books, documents, papers, records, including, but not limited to, financial records of Contractor, which are not otherwise legally privileged information, and which County determines to be pertinent to this Agreement, for the purposes of making audit, evaluation, examination, excerpts, and transcripts during the period such records are to be maintained by Contractor. Further, County has the right, at all reasonable times, to audit, inspect, or otherwise evaluate the work performed or being performed under this Agreement.

C. Workload Data. Contractor shall promptly provide to County any and all workload or case data, which is not otherwise legally privileged information, upon the written request of either the County Administrator or the County Board of Supervisors.

15. NONDISCRIMINATION.

During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees shall not unlawfully discriminate in violation of any federal, state, or local law, against any employee, or applicant for employment, or person receiving services under this Agreement, because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, age, or sex. Contractor and his/her agents, officers, and employees shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code section 12900, et seq.), and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder in the California Code of Regulations. Contractor shall also abide by the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) and all amendments thereto, and all administrative rules and regulations issued pursuant to said act.

16. CANCELLATION.

This Agreement may be canceled by County without cause, and at will, for any reason by giving to Contractor sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel. Contractor may cancel this Agreement without cause, and at will, for any reason whatsoever by giving sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel to County.

17. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

Upon the termination of this Agreement or any extension thereof, County shall pay Contractor such compensation due, if any, prorated to the date of termination; and Contractor shall deliver all active and inactive case files to the person or office as the County Administrator shall designate in writing.

18. TERMINATION OF PREVIOUS AGREEMENT.

Contractor agrees that upon the execution of this Agreement by the parties hereto, any prior written Agreement for the provision of professional services as a Public Defender for the County of Inyo shall be terminated, and the consideration for the continued representation of clients in the courts of the County of Inyo shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement as of the effective date of this Agreement. It is further understood between the parties hereto that there are no oral agreements or representations between the parties affecting this Agreement and that this Agreement supersedes and cancels any and all previous negotiations, arrangements, agreements and understandings, if any, and none thereof shall be used to interpret or construe this Agreement.

19. ASSIGNMENT.

This is an agreement for the services of Contractor. County has relied upon the skills, knowledge, experience, and training of Contractor as an inducement to enter into this Agreement. Contractor shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement, or any part of it, without the express written consent of County. Further, Contractor shall not assign any monies due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County.

20. DEFAULT.

If the Contractor abandons the work, or fails to proceed with the work and services requested by County in a timely manner, or fails in any way as required to conduct the work and services as required by County, County may declare the Contractor in default and terminate this Agreement upon five (5) days written notice to Contractor.

21. WAIVER OF DEFAULT.

Waiver of any default by either party to this Agreement shall not be deemed to be waiver of any subsequent default. Waiver or breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach, and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of this Agreement unless this Agreement is modified as provided in paragraph twenty-eight (28) below.

22. CONFIDENTIALITY.

Contractor agrees to comply with the various provisions of the federal, state, and county laws, regulations, and ordinances providing that information and records kept, maintained, or accessible by Contractor in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, shall be privileged, restricted, or confidential. Contractor agrees to keep confidential all such information and records. Disclosure of such confidential, privileged, or protected information shall be made by Contractor only in compliance with law..

23. CONFLICTS.

Contractor agrees that he/she has no interest, and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with Contractor's performance of the work and services under this Agreement. Specifically, Contractor agrees not to engage in any private legal representations of any matter which would conflict or interfere with Contractor's ability to represent clients under this Agreement. Additionally, Contractor, during the term of this Agreement agrees not to advise or represent any person , corporation or entity with a claim or cause of action against the County of Inyo, its officers, agents, or employees.

24. POST AGREEMENT COVENANT.

Contractor agrees not to use any confidential, protected, or privileged information which is gained in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, for any personal benefit, gain, or enhancement.

25. SEVERABILITY.

If any portion of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, or if it is found in contravention of any federal, state, or county statute, ordinance, or regulation, the remaining provisions of this Agreement, or the application thereof, shall not be invalidated thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

SCOPE OF WORK:

1. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES.

A. WARRANTY. Contractor warrants that he/she has read and reviewed the contracts of all the other attorneys engaged by the County to provide professional services as public defenders (hereinafter referred to as "Contract Public Defenders") during the term of this Agreement. Such Agreements are by reference incorporated herein as though set forth in full. Contractor agrees and understands that he/she shall consult, confer, and agree with all the other Contract Public Defenders to, and shall provide legal representation and substitute handling and coverage of Contract Public Defender cases as required by the provisions below. Contractor agrees and understands that these provisions are of mutual benefit to Contractor and each of the other Contract Public Defenders, and does not entitle Contractor to any additional compensation under this Agreement.

B. DEFINITIONS.

1. "Attorney-Conflict of Interest" cases are those that would be within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender but for an attorney-client conflict of interest of that public defender. Attorney-client conflicts are those that are defined and recognized by applicable law.

2. "Time Conflict" cases are those that are within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender who is unable to fulfill his/her contractual duties to attend the courts and represent the clients in such cases for whatever reason including, but not limited to vacations, temporary illnesses, conflicting court calendars, or attendance at attorney education courses.

C. ATTORNEY-CLIENT CONFLICT OF INTEREST CASES. Except as may be provided in F. below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement, attached hereto and by referenced incorporated herein.

D. TIME CONFLICT CASES. Except as may be provided in E and F below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement.

E. TIME CONFLICT CASES LIMITATION. Contractor shall provide coverage for time conflict cases for which another Contract Public Defender is primarily responsible but for whatever reason, the duties of such other Contract Public Defender cannot be performed for a period of not more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days.

F. **WAIVER.** The requirements for Contractor to handle attorney-client conflict of interest and time conflict cases as required by this Agreement may be waived by the County Administrator where extenuating demands are placed upon Contractor during his/her representation of the following:

1. A defendant charged with a capital or other serious offense in which the death penalty or life imprisonment without possibility of parole is a possible sanction;
2. A minor, who, if charged and tried as an adult, may face the death penalty or life imprisonment without the possibility of parole;
3. A minor or parent(s) on a Writ arising out of a dependency case in which the Contractor represents such minor or parent(s).

CONFLICTS COVERAGE TABLE:

During the period of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases, and substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases as required by this Agreement, in the following types of cases and in the following priority among other Contract Public Defenders:

Primary Obligations:

First Priority	Felony Appointments, North and South County
First Priority	Sexually Violent Predator Cases
Second Priority:	Misdemeanors, North County
Third Priority:	Misdemeanors, South County

Secondary Obligations:

All other Conflict matters, including Delinquency, Dependency, Child Support, Mental Health and Conservatorship Cases, Patient Rights Advocate Cases, AB 109 Revocation Hearings and any other matter in which the County is obligated to provide public defender services.

Note: The Table listed above will be followed for the majority of the cases assigned to this Public Defender. However, a Judge, when assigning a case, will consider the experience, caseload, complexity of the case and prior representation of the same client, which may result in a Public Defender assigned a case out of the listed sequence. In addition, the County reserves the right to modify the conflicts coverage table as necessary to make consistent with other Public Defender contracts as they may be amended and as necessary to address legislative changes which may impact the County's obligation to provide Public Defender services.

SCHEDULE OF FEES:

1. COMPENSATION:

County shall pay to Contractor on or before the first (1st) day of each month during the term of the Agreement, the amount set forth below as full and complete compensation for Contractor's performance of all of the work and services required to be performed during that month by Contractor:

- A. From July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013: \$138,000 Annual; \$11,500/mo.
- B. From July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015: \$144,000 Annual; \$12,000/mo.

2. INCIDENTAL EXPENSES:

A. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provision of Sections 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized professional services required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person which Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Professional services shall include, but not be limited to, investigators, photographers, accident reconstruction experts, chemists, criminalists, psychologists, psychiatrists, physicians, and other legal counsel with specialized expertise. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for professional services, received written authorization for Contractor to engage the providers of specific professional services from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve engaging each provider of professional services as well as the amount of any fees, costs, and other expenses for such services. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for the expenses of professional services which are either in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge.

B. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provisions of Section 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized document photocopying which is in excess of 5,000 pages in any single case, and which is required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person whom Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for reimbursable photocopying, provide documentation to the County that Contractor has at his/her own expense made 5,000 copies of documents in a single case, and received written authorization for Contractor to incur reimbursable photocopying expenses from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve incurring expenses for photocopies in excess of 5,000 pages, shall set forth the number of additional pages authorized to be copied, and the authorized cost of such copying. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for copying expenses which are in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge, or which were incurred by the Contractor in making the first 5,000 photocopy pages in any single case.

However, Contractor will pay the monthly cost of this phone line plus the cost of any calls or other services billed to this line.
2. County will provide Contractor with reasonable access to County's copying facilities for duplicating documents, and FAX facilities for transmitting documents necessary to perform the work and services required under this Agreement. Contractor will promptly pay to County the County's actual cost of providing such copying and FAX services and facilities to Contractor.
3. County will provide to Contractor confidential storage for closed case files.
4. If Contractor is eligible for group health insurance coverage under the County's group health insurance plan or program, Contractor will have the option to purchase group health insurance coverage under such plan or program at Contractor's sole and entire cost, and at no cost or obligation to the County.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF INYO
AND ELIZABETH CORPORA
FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER**

INTRODUCTION

WHEREAS, the County of Inyo (hereinafter referred to as "County") requires professional services for the purpose of providing legal representation before the various courts, for certain qualified indigent persons who fall within any of the following classifications:

1. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on felony charges (hereinafter referred to as "Felony cases") except those cases where the result may be a sentence of life without parole;
2. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on misdemeanor charges (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor cases");
3. Minors brought before the Juvenile Court of Inyo County for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 601 and 602 (hereinafter referred to as "Delinquency cases");
4. Minors and/or parents brought before the Superior Court of Inyo County and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 (hereinafter referred to as "Dependency cases");
5. Persons ordered to show cause before the Superior Court of Inyo County re contempt for alleged failure to pay child support or before said court in proceedings to establish paternity and support (hereinafter referred to as "Child Support cases");
6. Persons involuntarily detained by Inyo County for treatment and evaluation pursuant to sections 5150 and 5170 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, or for prolonged subsequent detention pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 5250, 5260, 5300, 5304 or 6500; or proposed L.P.S. Conservatees and L.P.S. Conservatees brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal pursuant to sections 5350 or 5352.1 of the Welfare and Institutions Code; or persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for post adjudication of criminal mental health status preceding under Penal Code 1026 et. seq.; Children in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7861); or indigent parents in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7860); or indigent non-custodial parents in proceedings to terminate the parent's rights for willful failure to communicate and support (Family Code section 7860); or conservatees, proposed conservatees, or persons alleged to lack legal capacity or unable to retain legal counsel and requesting the appointment of counsel in proceedings to establish a conservatorship or appoint a proposed conservator, terminate conservatorship, remove the conservator, or obtain an order authorizing removal of a temporary conservatee from the temporary conservatee's place of residence (Probate Code section 1471), [hereinafter all referred to as "Mental Health cases"];

7. Patients for whom the Contractor is appointed the patients rights advocate pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5520, by the Inyo County Mental Health Director (hereinafter referred to as "Patient Rights Advocate Cases");
8. Persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court for determinations and commitments under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 6600 et seq. (hereinafter referred to as "Sexually Violent Predator cases");
9. Persons taking misdemeanor criminal appeals from the Inyo County Superior Court to the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of Inyo County (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor Appeal cases"); and
10. Persons requiring Public Defender representation under the provisions of AB 109.

WHEREAS, the County has by contract divided performance of the required professional services described above, between independent contractors engaged to perform public defender services for the County. The purpose of said contracts for public defender services is to provide competent and effective legal representation to qualified indigent persons appearing before the various courts and to minimize the expenditure of County funds for the payment of private attorneys appearing as public defenders, pro tempore, in cases where the other contract public defenders are unable to appear due to attorney-client and/or time conflicts of interest.

WHEREAS, the County has the need for ELIZABETH CORPORA of BISHOP, CALIFORNIA (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor") to provide professional legal services as a Public Defender for Inyo County (North and South).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, terms, and conditions hereinafter set forth, the County and Contractor agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. SCOPE OF WORK.

The Contractor shall furnish to the County, upon its request, all of those services and work set forth in the Scope of Work, Attachment A, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. Requests by the County to the Contractor to perform under this Agreement will be made by the judges of the Superior Court of Inyo County. Requests to the Contractor for work or services to be performed under this Agreement, will be based upon the County's need for such services. The County makes no guarantee or warranty, of any nature, as to the level or amount of services or work which will be requested or required of the Contractor by the County under this Agreement. County by this Agreement incurs no obligation or requirement to compensate Contractor, over and above that provided for in this Agreement, for the performance of any services or work required to be performed by Contractor under this Agreement.

Services and work provided by the Contractor at the County's request under this Agreement will be performed in a manner consistent with the requirements and standards established by applicable federal, state, and County laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions. Such laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions include, but are not limited to, those which are referred to in this Agreement.

2. TERM.

A. Initial Term and Options.

The initial term of this Agreement is for a three (3) year period from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2015.

3. CONSIDERATION.

A. Compensation. County shall pay Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein, for the performance of the services and work described in Attachment A.

B. Travel and Per Diem. Contractor will not be paid or reimbursed travel expenses or per diem for any in-county travel performed by Contractor in providing services and work under this Agreement. County shall reimburse Contractor for Court authorized out-of-county travel expenses and per diem which Contractor incurs in providing work and services under this Agreement. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any out-of-County travel expenses or per diem, receive written authorization for Contractor to travel out-of-county on the case from the assigned judge. Properly authorized out-of-county travel and per diem expenses will be reimbursed in the same amount and to the same extent as County reimburses its permanent status employees for such expenses. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for out-of-county travel or per diem expenses which are either in excess of the amounts that may be paid to County's permanent status employees, or which are incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned judge.

C. Incidental Expenses. County shall reimburse Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, for those incidental expenses which are specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees and which are necessarily incurred by the Contractor in providing the services and work under this Agreement. Reimbursement by County for such incidental expenses will be limited to Contractor's actual cost without regard to any administrative or overhead expenses incurred by Contractor in obtaining or utilizing such incidental services or supplies. Reimbursement for actual costs will not exceed the amounts set forth in the Schedule of Fees.

D. No additional consideration. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, Contractor shall not be entitled to, nor receive, from County, any additional consideration, compensation, salary, wages, or other type of remuneration for any public defender services provided either under the terms of this Agreement or as may be requested or appointed by the Superior Court of California in and for the County of Inyo ("out of contract" appointments) without prior written approval by the County Administrative Officer ("CAO"). In addition, Contractor shall not, by virtue of this Agreement, to consideration in the form of overtime, health insurance benefits, retirement benefits, disability retirement benefits, sick leave, vacation time, paid holidays, or other paid leaves of absence of any type or kind whatsoever.

E. Limit upon amount payable under Agreement. The total sum of all compensation payments made by the County to Contractor under this Agreement, including incidental, travel and per diem expenses, if any, shall not exceed \$ n/a Dollars (hereinafter referred to as "contract limit"). County expressly reserves the right to deny any payment or reimbursement to Contractor which is in excess of the contract limit.

F. Billing and payment. County shall pay to Contractor the monthly payments set forth in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, without any billing or statement from Contractor. Within 30 days of Contractor incurring any authorized incidental, travel, or per diem expenses, Contractor shall submit a statement to the County. The statement will itemize each incidental, travel, or per diem expense and identify the date and case in which the expense was incurred. The statement will include a conformed copy of the court authorization for travel and/or incidental expenses and receipts for lodging, meals, and other incidental expenses in accordance with the County's accounting procedures and rules. County will make payment to Contractor for all authorized reimbursable expenses for which a statement is properly submitted, within 30 days of the County's receipt of such statement.

G. Federal and State taxes.

(1) Except as provided in subparagraph (2) below, County will not withhold any federal or state income taxes or social security from any payments made by County to Contractor under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

(2) County will withhold California State income taxes from payments made under this Agreement to non-California resident independent contractors when it is anticipated that total annual payments to Contractor under this Agreement will exceed one thousand four hundred ninety nine dollars (\$1,499.00).

(3) Except as set forth above, County has no obligation to withhold any taxes or payments from sums paid by County to Contractor under this Agreement. Payment of all taxes and other assessments on such sums is the sole responsibility of Contractor. County has no responsibility or liability for payment of Contractor's taxes or assessments.

(4) The total amounts paid by County to Contractor, and taxes withheld from payments to non-California residents, if any, will be reported annually to the Internal Revenue Service and the California State Franchise Tax Board.

4. WORK SCHEDULE.

Contractor's obligation is to perform, in a timely manner, those services and work identified in Attachment A. It is understood by Contractor that the performance of these services and work will require a varied schedule. Contractor will arrange his/her own schedule, but will coordinate with the courts of Inyo County, other Inyo County Contract Public Defenders, other counsel, and parties, as necessary, to insure that all services and work under this Agreement will be performed in a timely manner.

5. REQUIRED LICENSES, CERTIFICATES, AND PERMITS.

A. Any licenses, certificates, or permits required by the federal, state, county, or municipal governments, for Contractor to provide the services and work described in Attachment A must be procured by Contractor and be valid at the time Contractor enters into this Agreement. Further, during the term of this Agreement Contractor must maintain such licenses, certificates, and permits in full force and effect. Licenses, certificates, and permits may include, but are not limited to, driver's license, professional licenses or certificates, and business licenses. Such licenses, certificates, and permits will be procured and maintained in force by Contractor at no expense to the County. Contractor will provide County, upon execution of this Agreement, with evidence of current and valid licenses, certificates and permits which are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A. Where there is a dispute between Contractor and County as to what licenses, certificates, and permits are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A, County reserves the right to make such determinations for purposes of this Agreement.

B. Contractor warrants that it is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in covered transactions by any federal department or agency. Contractor also warrants that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal funds as listed in the List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Non-procurement Programs issued by the General Services Administration available at: <http://www.epls.gov>.

6. COUNTY PROVIDED SERVICES AND SUPPLIES.

County will provide Contractor with those services and supplies which are specifically identified in the Schedule of County Provided Services and Supplies, Attachment C, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. County incurs no obligation or requirement to reimburse or compensate Contractor if he/she for any reason either does not use the County provided services and supplies, or procures similar services and supplies from other sources.

7. COUNTY PROPERTY.

Any personal property such as, but not limited to, protective or safety devices, badges, identification cards, keys, etc., provided to Contractor by County pursuant to this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of County. Contractor will use reasonable care to protect, safeguard and maintain such items while they are in Contractor's possession. Contractor will be financially responsible for any loss or damage to such items, partial or total, which is the result of Contractor's negligence.

8. PRODUCTS OF CONTRACTOR'S WORK AND SERVICES.

Any and all compositions, publications, plans, designs, specifications, blueprints, maps, formulas, processes, photographs, slides, video tapes, computer programs, computer disks, computer tapes, memory chips, soundtracks, audio recordings, films, audio-visual presentations, exhibits, reports, studies, works of art, inventions, patents, trademarks, copyrights, or intellectual properties of any kind which are created, produced, assembled, compiled by, or are the result, product, or manifestation of, Contractor's services or work under this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of the Contractor.

9. OFFICE SPACE, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, ETC.

Except for the County Provided Services and Supplies provided for in Section 6 above, Contractor shall provide all such office space, supplies, equipment, vehicles, reference materials and books, postage, letterhead, stationery, secretarial services, receptionist services, legal assistant services, telephone services, duplicating services, and case storage facilities as are necessary to provide the work and services required of Contractor by this Agreement. Except for those incidental expenses specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, County is not obligated to reimburse or pay Contractor for any expense or cost incurred by Contractor in procuring or maintaining such items or services. Responsibility for the costs and expenses incurred by Contractor in providing and maintaining items or services not specifically set forth in the Schedule of Fees (Attachment B) as Incidental Expenses, is the sole responsibility and obligation of Contractor.

10. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

Contractor shall provide statutory California Worker's Compensation coverage and Employer's Liability coverage for not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for all employees engaged in services or operations under this Agreement. The County of Inyo, its agents, officers and employees shall be named as additional insured or a waiver of subrogation shall be provided.

11. INSURANCE.

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder and the results of that work by the Contractor, his agents, representatives or employees.

A. Minimum Scope of Insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001).
2. Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, code 1 (any auto).

3. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.

B. Minimum Limits of Insurance. Contractor shall maintain limits no less than:

1. General Liability (including operations, products and completed operations as applicable): \$100,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
2. Automobile Liability: \$300,000.00 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
3. Employer's Liability: \$500,000.00 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
4. Errors and Omissions Liability: \$500,000.00 per occurrence.

C. Deductibles and Self-insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. At the option of the County, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers; or the Contractor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the County guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses.

D. Other Insurance Provisions. The commercial general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. The County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance, or as a separate owner's policy (CG 20 10 11 85).
2. For any claims related to this project, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
3. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the County.
4. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code.

E. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII. The County at its option may waive this requirement.

F. Verification of Coverage. Contractor shall furnish the County with original certificates and amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. The endorsements should be on forms provided by the County or on other than the County's forms, provided those endorsements or policies conform to the requirements. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified

copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements effecting the coverage required by the specifications at any time.

12. STATUS OF CONTRACTOR.

All acts of Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees, relating to the performance of this Agreement, shall be performed as independent contractors, and not as agents, officers, or employees of County. Contractor, by virtue of this Agreement, has no authority to bind or incur any obligation on behalf of County. Except as expressly provided in Attachment A, Contractor has no authority or responsibility to exercise any rights or power vested in the County. No agent, officer, or employee of the County is to be considered an employee of Contractor. It is understood by both Contractor and County that this Agreement shall not under any circumstances be construed or considered to create an employer-employee relationship or a joint venture. As an independent contractor:

A. Contractor shall determine the method, details, and means of performing the work and services to be provided by Contractor under this Agreement.

B. Contractor shall be responsible to County only for the requirements and results specified in this Agreement, and except as expressly provided in this Agreement, shall not be subjected to County's control with respect to the physical action or activities of Contractor in fulfillment of this Agreement.

C. Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees are, and at all times during the term of this Agreement shall, represent and conduct themselves as independent contractors, and not as employees of County.

13. DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION.

Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless County, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, resulting from, or in connection with, the performance of this Agreement by Contractor, or Contractor's agents, officers, or employees. Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless applies to any actual or alleged personal injury, death, or damage or destruction to tangible or intangible property, including the loss of use. Contractor's obligation under this paragraph extends to any claim, damage, loss, liability, expense, or other cost which is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, his/her agents, employees, supplier, or any one directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts or omissions any of them may be liable.

Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless under the provisions of this paragraph is not limited to, or restricted by, any requirement in this Agreement for Contractor to procure and maintain a policy of insurance.

To the extent permitted by law, County shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, or resulting from, the active negligence, or wrongful acts of County, its officers, or employees.

14. RECORDS AND AUDIT.

A. Records. Contractor shall prepare and maintain all records required by the various provisions of this Agreement, federal, state, county, municipal, ordinances, regulations, and directions. Contractor shall maintain these records for a minimum of four (4) years from the termination or completion of this Agreement. Contractor may fulfill its obligation to maintain records as required by this paragraph by substitute photographs, microphotographs, or other authentic reproduction of such records.

B. Inspections and Audits. Any authorized representative of County shall have access to any books, documents, papers, records, including, but not limited to, financial records of Contractor, which are not otherwise legally privileged information, and which County determines to be pertinent to this Agreement, for the purposes of making audit, evaluation, examination, excerpts, and transcripts during the period such records are to be maintained by Contractor. Further, County has the right, at all reasonable times, to audit, inspect, or otherwise evaluate the work performed or being performed under this Agreement.

C. Workload Data. Contractor shall promptly provide to County any and all workload or case data, which is not otherwise legally privileged information, upon the written request of either the County Administrator or the County Board of Supervisors.

15. NONDISCRIMINATION.

During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees shall not unlawfully discriminate in violation of any federal, state, or local law, against any employee, or applicant for employment, or person receiving services under this Agreement, because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, age, or sex. Contractor and his/her agents, officers, and employees shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code section 12900, et seq.), and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder in the California Code of Regulations. Contractor shall also abide by the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) and all amendments thereto, and all administrative rules and regulations issued pursuant to said act.

16. CANCELLATION.

This Agreement may be canceled by County without cause, and at will, for any reason by giving to Contractor sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel. Contractor may cancel this Agreement without cause, and at will, for any reason whatsoever by giving sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel to County.

17. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

Upon the termination of this Agreement or any extension thereof, County shall pay Contractor such compensation due, if any, prorated to the date of termination; and Contractor shall deliver all active and inactive case files to the person or office as the County Administrator shall designate in writing.

18. TERMINATION OF PREVIOUS AGREEMENT.

Contractor agrees that upon the execution of this Agreement by the parties hereto, any prior written Agreement for the provision of professional services as a Public Defender for the County of Inyo shall be terminated, and the consideration for the continued representation of clients in the courts of the County of Inyo shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement as of the effective date of this Agreement. It is further understood between the parties hereto that there are no oral agreements or representations between the parties affecting this Agreement and that this Agreement supersedes and cancels any and all previous negotiations, arrangements, agreements and understandings, if any, and none thereof shall be used to interpret or construe this Agreement.

19. ASSIGNMENT.

This is an agreement for the services of Contractor. County has relied upon the skills, knowledge, experience, and training of Contractor as an inducement to enter into this Agreement. Contractor shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement, or any part of it, without the express written consent of County. Further, Contractor shall not assign any monies due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County.

20. DEFAULT.

If the Contractor abandons the work, or fails to proceed with the work and services requested by County in a timely manner, or fails in any way as required to conduct the work and services as required by County, County may declare the Contractor in default and terminate this Agreement upon five (5) days written notice to Contractor.

21. WAIVER OF DEFAULT.

Waiver of any default by either party to this Agreement shall not be deemed to be waiver of any subsequent default. Waiver or breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach, and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of this Agreement unless this Agreement is modified as provided in paragraph twenty-eight (28) below.

22. CONFIDENTIALITY.

Contractor agrees to comply with the various provisions of the federal, state, and county laws, regulations, and ordinances providing that information and records kept, maintained, or accessible by Contractor in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, shall be privileged, restricted, or confidential. Contractor agrees to keep confidential all such information and records. Disclosure of such confidential, privileged, or protected information shall be made by Contractor only in compliance with law..

23. CONFLICTS.

Contractor agrees that he/she has no interest, and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with Contractor's performance of the work and services under this Agreement. Specifically, Contractor agrees not to engage in any private legal representations of any matter which would conflict or interfere with Contractor's ability to represent clients under this Agreement. Additionally, Contractor, during the term of this Agreement agrees not to advise or represent any person , corporation or entity with a claim or cause of action against the County of Inyo, its officers, agents, or employees.

24. POST AGREEMENT COVENANT.

Contractor agrees not to use any confidential, protected, or privileged information which is gained in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, for any personal benefit, gain, or enhancement.

25. SEVERABILITY.

If any portion of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, or if it is found in contravention of any federal, state, or county statute, ordinance, or regulation, the remaining provisions of this Agreement, or the application thereof, shall not be invalidated thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

26. FUNDING LIMITATION.

The ability of County to enter this Agreement is based upon available funding from various sources. In the event that such funding fails, is reduced, or is modified, from one or more sources, County has the option to cancel, reduce, or modify this Agreement, or any of its terms within ten (10) days of its notifying Contractor of the cancellation, reduction, or modification of available funding. Any reduction or modification of this Agreement made pursuant to this provision must comply with the requirements of paragraph twenty-eight (28) (Amendment).

FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER**

TERM:

FROM: July 1, 2012 TO: June 30, 2015

SCOPE OF WORK:

1. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES.

A. WARRANTY. Contractor warrants that he/she has read and reviewed the contracts of all the other attorneys engaged by the County to provide professional services as public defenders (hereinafter referred to as "Contract Public Defenders") during the term of this Agreement. Such Agreements are by reference incorporated herein as though set forth in full. Contractor agrees and understands that he/she shall consult, confer, and agree with all the other Contract Public Defenders to, and shall provide legal representation and substitute handling and coverage of Contract Public Defender cases as required by the provisions below. Contractor agrees and understands that these provisions are of mutual benefit to Contractor and each of the other Contract Public Defenders, and does not entitle Contractor to any additional compensation under this Agreement.

B. DEFINITIONS.

1. "Attorney-Conflict of Interest" cases are those that would be within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender but for an attorney-client conflict of interest of that public defender. Attorney-client conflicts are those that are defined and recognized by applicable law.

2. "Time Conflict" cases are those that are within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender who is unable to fulfill his/her contractual duties to attend the courts and represent the clients in such cases for whatever reason including, but not limited to vacations, temporary illnesses, conflicting court calendars, or attendance at attorney education courses.

C. ATTORNEY-CLIENT CONFLICT OF INTEREST CASES. Except as may be provided in F. below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement, attached hereto and by referenced incorporated herein.

D. TIME CONFLICT CASES. Except as may be provided in E and F below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement.

E. TIME CONFLICT CASES LIMITATION. Contractor shall provide coverage for time conflict cases for which another Contract Public Defender is primarily responsible but for whatever reason, the duties of such other Contract Public Defender cannot be performed for a period of not more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days.

F. **WAIVER.** The requirements for Contractor to handle attorney-client conflict of interest and time conflict cases as required by this Agreement may be waived by the County Administrator where extenuating demands are placed upon Contractor during his/her representation of the following:

1. A defendant charged with a capital or other serious offense in which the death penalty or life imprisonment without possibility of parole is a possible sanction;
2. A minor, who, if charged and tried as an adult, may face the death penalty or life imprisonment without the possibility of parole;
3. A minor or parent(s) on a Writ arising out of a dependency case in which the Contractor represents such minor or parent(s).

CONFLICTS COVERAGE TABLE:

During the period of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases, and substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases as required by this Agreement, in the following types of cases and in the following priority among other Contract Public Defenders:

Primary Obligations:	Dependency Cases Delinquency Cases Child Support Cases Patient's Rights Advocate Cases Mental Health and Conservatorship Cases
Secondary Obligations:	All other Conflict matters, including felony, misdemeanor, sexually violent predator cases, AB 109 Revocation Hearings and any other matter in which the County is obligated to provide public defender services.

Note: The Table listed above will be followed for the majority of the cases assigned to this Public Defender. However, a Judge, when assigning a case, will consider the experience, caseload, complexity of the case and prior representation of the same client, which may result in a Public Defender assigned a case out of the listed sequence. In addition, the County reserves the right to modify the conflicts coverage table as necessary to make consistent with other Public Defender contracts as they may be amended and as necessary to address legislative changes which may impact the County's obligation to provide Public Defender services.

SCHEDULE OF FEES:

1. COMPENSATION:

County shall pay to Contractor on or before the first (1st) day of each month during the term of the Agreement, the amount set forth below as full and complete compensation for Contractor's performance of all of the work and services required to be performed during that month by Contractor:

A. From July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2015: \$113,000 Annual; \$9,417.66/mo.

2. INCIDENTAL EXPENSES:

A. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provision of Sections 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized professional services required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person which Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Professional services shall include, but not be limited to, investigators, photographers, accident reconstruction experts, chemists, criminalists, psychologists, psychiatrists, physicians, and other legal counsel with specialized expertise. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for professional services, received written authorization for Contractor to engage the providers of specific professional services from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve engaging each provider of professional services as well as the amount of any fees, costs, and other expenses for such services. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for the expenses of professional services which are either in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge.

B. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provisions of Section 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized document photocopying which is in excess of 5,000 pages in any single case, and which is required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person whom Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for reimbursable photocopying, provide documentation to the County that Contractor has at his/her own expense made 5,000 copies of documents in a single case, and received written authorization for Contractor to incur reimbursable photocopying expenses from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve incurring expenses for photocopies in excess of 5,000 pages, shall set forth the number of additional pages authorized to be copied, and the authorized cost of such copying. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for copying expenses which are in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge, or which were incurred by the Contractor in making the first 5,000 photocopy pages in any single case.

However, Contractor will pay the monthly cost of this phone line plus the cost of any calls or other services billed to this line.
2. County will provide Contractor with reasonable access to County's copying facilities for duplicating documents, and FAX facilities for transmitting documents necessary to perform the work and services required under this Agreement. Contractor will promptly pay to County the County's actual cost of providing such copying and FAX services and facilities to Contractor.
3. County will provide to Contractor confidential storage for closed case files.
4. If Contractor is eligible for group health insurance coverage under the County's group health insurance plan or program, Contractor will have the option to purchase group health insurance coverage under such plan or program at Contractor's sole and entire cost, and at no cost or obligation to the County.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF INYO
AND PAUL DEQUATTRO
FOR THE PROVISION OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AS A PUBLIC DEFENDER**

INTRODUCTION

WHEREAS, the County of Inyo (hereinafter referred to as "County") requires professional services for the purpose of providing legal representation before the various courts, for certain qualified indigent persons who fall within any of the following classifications:

1. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on felony charges (hereinafter referred to as "Felony cases") except those cases where the result may be a sentence of life without parole;
2. Criminal defendants brought before the Superior Courts of Inyo County on misdemeanor charges (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor cases");
3. Minors brought before the Juvenile Court of Inyo County for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 601 and 602 (hereinafter referred to as "Delinquency cases");
4. Minors and/or parents brought before the Superior Court of Inyo County and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for proceedings under Welfare and Institutions Code section 300 (hereinafter referred to as "Dependency cases");
5. Persons ordered to show cause before the Superior Court of Inyo County re contempt for alleged failure to pay child support or before said court in proceedings to establish paternity and support (hereinafter referred to as "Child Support cases");
6. Persons involuntarily detained by Inyo County for treatment and evaluation pursuant to sections 5150 and 5170 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, or for prolonged subsequent detention pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code sections 5250, 5260, 5300, 5304 or 6500; or proposed L.P.S. Conservatees and L.P.S. Conservatees brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal pursuant to sections 5350 or 5352.1 of the Welfare and Institutions Code; or persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court and/or appropriate Courts of Appeal for post adjudication of criminal mental health status preceding under Penal Code 1026 et. seq.; Children in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7861); or indigent parents in proceedings to declare child free from parental custody and control (Family Code section 7860); or indigent non-custodial parents in proceedings to terminate the parent's rights for willful failure to communicate and support (Family Code section 7860); or conservatees, proposed conservatees, or persons alleged to lack legal capacity or unable to retain legal counsel and requesting the appointment of counsel in proceedings to establish a conservatorship or appoint a proposed conservator, terminate conservatorship, remove the conservator, or obtain an order authorizing removal of a temporary conservatee from the temporary conservatee's place of residence (Probate Code section 1471), [hereinafter all referred to as "Mental Health cases"];

7. Patients for whom the Contractor is appointed the patients rights advocate pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5520, by the Inyo County Mental Health Director (hereinafter referred to as "Patient Rights Advocate Cases");
8. Persons brought before the Inyo County Superior Court for determinations and commitments under Welfare and Institutions Code Section 6600 et seq. (hereinafter referred to as "Sexually Violent Predator cases");
9. Persons taking misdemeanor criminal appeals from the Inyo County Superior Court to the Appellate Division of the Superior Court of Inyo County (hereinafter referred to as "Misdemeanor Appeal cases"); and
10. Persons requiring Public Defender representation under the provisions of AB 109.

WHEREAS, the County has by contract divided performance of the required professional services described above, between independent contractors engaged to perform public defender services for the County. The purpose of said contracts for public defender services is to provide competent and effective legal representation to qualified indigent persons appearing before the various courts and to minimize the expenditure of County funds for the payment of private attorneys appearing as public defenders, pro tempore, in cases where the other contract public defenders are unable to appear due to attorney-client and/or time conflicts of interest.

WHEREAS, the County has the need for PAUL DEQUATTRO of BISHOP, CALIFORNIA (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor") to provide professional legal services as a Public Defender for Inyo County (North and South).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, terms, and conditions hereinafter set forth, the County and Contractor agree as follows:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. SCOPE OF WORK.

The Contractor shall furnish to the County, upon its request, all of those services and work set forth in the Scope of Work, Attachment A, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. Requests by the County to the Contractor to perform under this Agreement will be made by the judges of the Superior Court of Inyo County. Requests to the Contractor for work or services to be performed under this Agreement, will be based upon the County's need for such services. The County makes no guarantee or warranty, of any nature, as to the level or amount of services or work which will be requested or required of the Contractor by the County under this Agreement. County by this Agreement incurs no obligation or requirement to compensate Contractor, over and above that provided for in this Agreement, for the performance of any services or work required to be performed by Contractor under this Agreement.

Services and work provided by the Contractor at the County's request under this Agreement will be performed in a manner consistent with the requirements and standards established by applicable federal, state, and County laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions. Such laws, ordinances, regulations, and resolutions include, but are not limited to, those which are referred to in this Agreement.

2. TERM.

A. Initial Term and Options.

August 1, 2012

The initial term of this Agreement is for a one (1) year period from ~~July 1, 2012~~ to June 30, 2013, with the option to extend the terms of this Agreement for an additional two (2) year period from July 1, 2013 to June 20, 2015 subject to Contractor providing notice to the County no less than 60 days prior to the termination of the initial term of this Agreement of Contractor's intent to exercise said option and Contractor not being in breach of any condition contained in this Agreement.

3. CONSIDERATION.

A. Compensation. County shall pay Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein, for the performance of the services and work described in Attachment A.

B. Travel and Per Diem. Contractor will not be paid or reimbursed travel expenses or per diem for any in-county travel performed by Contractor in providing services and work under this Agreement. County shall reimburse Contractor for Court authorized out-of-county travel expenses and per diem which Contractor incurs in providing work and services under this Agreement. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any out-of-County travel expenses or per diem, receive written authorization for Contractor to travel out-of-county on the case from the assigned judge. Properly authorized out-of-county travel and per diem expenses will be reimbursed in the same amount and to the same extent as County reimburses its permanent status employees for such expenses. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for out-of-county travel or per diem expenses which are either in excess of the amounts that may be paid to County's permanent status employees, or which are incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned judge.

C. Incidental Expenses. County shall reimburse Contractor in accordance with the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, for those incidental expenses which are specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees and which are necessarily incurred by the Contractor in providing the services and work under this Agreement. Reimbursement by County for such incidental expenses will be limited to Contractor's actual cost without regard to any administrative or overhead expenses incurred by Contractor in obtaining or utilizing such incidental services or supplies. Reimbursement for actual costs will not exceed the amounts set forth in the Schedule of Fees.

D. No additional consideration. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, Contractor shall not be entitled to, nor receive, from County, any additional consideration, compensation, salary, wages, or other type of remuneration for any public defender services provided either under the terms of this Agreement or as may be requested or appointed by the Superior Court of California in and for the County of Inyo ("out of contract" appointments) without prior written approval by the County Administrative Officer ("CAO"). In addition, Contractor shall not, by virtue of this Agreement, to consideration in the form of overtime, health insurance benefits, retirement benefits, disability retirement benefits, sick leave, vacation time, paid holidays, or other paid leaves of absence of any type or kind whatsoever.

E. Limit upon amount payable under Agreement. The total sum of all compensation payments made by the County to Contractor under this Agreement, including incidental, travel and per diem expenses, if any, shall not exceed \$ n/a Dollars (hereinafter referred to as "contract limit"). County expressly reserves the right to deny any payment or reimbursement to Contractor which is in excess of the contract limit.

F. Billing and payment. County shall pay to Contractor the monthly payments set forth in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, without any billing or statement from Contractor. Within 30 days of Contractor incurring any authorized incidental, travel, or per diem expenses, Contractor shall submit a statement to the County. The statement will itemize each incidental, travel, or per diem expense and identify the date and case in which the expense was incurred. The statement will include a conformed

copy of the court authorization for travel and/or incidental expenses and receipts for lodging, meals, and other incidental expenses in accordance with the County' accounting procedures and rules. County will make payment to Contractor for all authorized reimbursable expenses for which a statement is properly submitted, within 30 days of the County's receipt of such statement.

G. Federal and State taxes.

(1) Except as provided in subparagraph (2) below, County will not withhold any federal or state income taxes or social security from any payments made by County to Contractor under the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

(2) County will withhold California State income taxes from payments made under this Agreement to non-California resident independent contractors when it is anticipated that total annual payments to Contractor under this Agreement will exceed one thousand four hundred ninety nine dollars (\$1,499.00).

(3) Except as set forth above, County has no obligation to withhold any taxes or payments from sums paid by County to Contractor under this Agreement. Payment of all taxes and other assessments on such sums is the sole responsibility of Contractor. County has no responsibility or liability for payment of Contractor's taxes or assessments.

(4) The total amounts paid by County to Contractor, and taxes withheld from payments to non-California residents, if any, will be reported annually to the Internal Revenue Service and the California State Franchise Tax Board.

4. WORK SCHEDULE.

Contractor's obligation is to perform, in a timely manner, those services and work identified in Attachment A. It is understood by Contractor that the performance of these services and work will require a varied schedule. Contractor will arrange his/her own schedule, but will coordinate with the courts of Inyo County, other Inyo County Contract Public Defenders, other counsel, and parties, as necessary, to insure that all services and work under this Agreement will be performed in a timely manner.

5. REQUIRED LICENSES, CERTIFICATES, AND PERMITS.

A. Any licenses, certificates, or permits required by the federal, state, county, or municipal governments, for Contractor to provide the services and work described in Attachment A must be procured by Contractor and be valid at the time Contractor enters into this Agreement. Further, during the term of this Agreement Contractor must maintain such licenses, certificates, and permits in full force and effect. Licenses, certificates, and permits may include, but are not limited to, driver's license, professional licenses or certificates, and business licenses. Such licenses, certificates, and permits will be procured and maintained in force by Contractor at no expense to the County. Contractor will provide County, upon execution of this Agreement, with evidence of current and valid licenses, certificates and permits which are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A. Where there is a dispute between Contractor and County as to what licenses, certificates, and permits are required to perform the services identified in Attachment A, County reserves the right to make such determinations for purposes of this Agreement.

B. Contractor warrants that it is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in covered transactions by any federal department or agency. Contractor also warrants that it is not suspended or debarred from receiving federal funds as listed in the List of Parties Excluded from Federal Procurement or Non-procurement Programs issued by the General Services Administration available at: <http://www.epls.gov>.

6. COUNTY PROVIDED SERVICES AND SUPPLIES.

County will provide Contractor with those services and supplies which are specifically identified in the Schedule of County Provided Services and Supplies, Attachment C, attached hereto and by reference incorporated herein. County incurs no obligation or requirement to reimburse or compensate Contractor if he/she for any reason either does not use the County provided services and supplies, or procures similar services and supplies from other sources.

7. COUNTY PROPERTY.

Any personal property such as, but not limited to, protective or safety devices, badges, identification cards, keys, etc., provided to Contractor by County pursuant to this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of County. Contractor will use reasonable care to protect, safeguard and maintain such items while they are in Contractor's possession. Contractor will be financially responsible for any loss or damage to such items, partial or total, which is the result of Contractor's negligence.

8. PRODUCTS OF CONTRACTOR'S WORK AND SERVICES.

Any and all compositions, publications, plans, designs, specifications, blueprints, maps, formulas, processes, photographs, slides, video tapes, computer programs, computer disks, computer tapes, memory chips, soundtracks, audio recordings, films, audio-visual presentations, exhibits, reports, studies, works of art, inventions, patents, trademarks, copyrights, or intellectual properties of any kind which are created, produced, assembled, compiled by, or are the result, product, or manifestation of, Contractor's services or work under this Agreement are, and at the termination of this Agreement remain, the sole and exclusive property of the Contractor.

9. OFFICE SPACE, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, ETC.

Except for the County Provided Services and Supplies provided for in Section 6 above, Contractor shall provide all such office space, supplies, equipment, vehicles, reference materials and books, postage, letterhead, stationery, secretarial services, receptionist services, legal assistant services, telephone services, duplicating services, and case storage facilities as are necessary to provide the work and services required of Contractor by this Agreement. Except for those incidental expenses specifically identified in the Schedule of Fees, Attachment B, County is not obligated to reimburse or pay Contractor for any expense or cost incurred by Contractor in procuring or maintaining such items or services. Responsibility for the costs and expenses incurred by Contractor in providing and maintaining items or services not specifically set forth in the Schedule of Fees (Attachment B) as Incidental Expenses, is the sole responsibility and obligation of Contractor.

10. WORKERS' COMPENSATION.

Contractor shall provide statutory California Worker's Compensation coverage and Employer's Liability coverage for not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence for all employees engaged in services or operations under this Agreement. The County of Inyo, its agents, officers and employees shall be named as additional insured or a waiver of subrogation shall be provided.

11. INSURANCE.

Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of the Agreement, contract insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the work hereunder and the results of that work by the Contractor, his agents, representatives or employees.

A. Minimum Scope of Insurance. Coverage shall be at least as broad as:

1. Insurance Services Office Commercial General Liability coverage (occurrence Form CG 0001).

2. Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering Automobile Liability, code 1 (any auto).
3. Workers' Compensation insurance as required by the State of California and Employer's Liability Insurance.

B. Minimum Limits of Insurance. Contractor shall maintain limits no less than:

1. General Liability (including operations, products and completed operations as applicable): \$100,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury and property damage. If Commercial General Liability insurance or other form with a general aggregate limit is used, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this project/location or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.
2. Automobile Liability: \$300,000.00 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
3. Employer's Liability: \$500,000.00 per accident for bodily injury or disease.
4. Errors and Omissions Liability: \$500,000.00 per occurrence.

C. Deductibles and Self-insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. At the option of the County, either the insurer shall reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers; or the Contractor shall provide a financial guarantee satisfactory to the County guaranteeing payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense expenses.

D. Other Insurance Provisions. The commercial general liability and automobile liability policies are to contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

1. The County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers are to be covered as insureds with respect to liability arising out of automobiles owned, leased, hired or borrowed by or on behalf of the Contractor; and with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance, or as a separate owner's policy (CG 20 10 11 85).
2. For any claims related to this project, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
3. Each insurance policy required by this clause shall be endorsed to state that coverage shall not be canceled by either party, except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, has been given to the County.
4. Coverage shall not extend to any indemnity coverage for the active negligence of the additional insured in any case where an agreement to indemnify the additional insured would be invalid under Subdivision (b) of Section 2782 of the Civil Code.

E. Acceptability of Insurers. Insurance is to be placed with insurers with a current A.M. Best's rating of no less than A:VII. The County at its option may waive this requirement.

F. Verification of Coverage. Contractor shall furnish the County with original certificates and amendatory endorsements effecting coverage required by this clause. The endorsements should be on forms provided by the County or on other than the County's forms, provided those endorsements or policies conform to the requirements. All certificates and endorsements are to be received and approved by the County before work commences. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements effecting the coverage required by the specifications at any time.

12. STATUS OF CONTRACTOR.

All acts of Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees, relating to the performance of this Agreement, shall be performed as independent contractors, and not as agents, officers, or employees of County. Contractor, by virtue of this Agreement, has no authority to bind or incur any obligation on behalf of County. Except as expressly provided in Attachment A, Contractor has no authority or responsibility to exercise any rights or power vested in the County. No agent, officer, or employee of the County is to be considered an employee of Contractor. It is understood by both Contractor and County that this Agreement shall not under any circumstances be construed or considered to create an employer-employee relationship or a joint venture. As an independent contractor:

A. Contractor shall determine the method, details, and means of performing the work and services to be provided by Contractor under this Agreement.

B. Contractor shall be responsible to County only for the requirements and results specified in this Agreement, and except as expressly provided in this Agreement, shall not be subjected to County's control with respect to the physical action or activities of Contractor in fulfillment of this Agreement.

C. Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees are, and at all times during the term of this Agreement shall, represent and conduct themselves as independent contractors, and not as employees of County.

13. DEFENSE AND INDEMNIFICATION.

Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless County, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, resulting from, or in connection with, the performance of this Agreement by Contractor, or Contractor's agents, officers, or employees. Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless applies to any actual or alleged personal injury, death, or damage or destruction to tangible or intangible property, including the loss of use. Contractor's obligation under this paragraph extends to any claim, damage, loss, liability, expense, or other cost which is caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor, his/her agents, employees, supplier, or any one directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or anyone for whose acts or omissions any of them may be liable.

Contractor's obligation to defend, indemnify, and hold the County, its agents, officers, and employees harmless under the provisions of this paragraph is not limited to, or restricted by, any requirement in this Agreement for Contractor to procure and maintain a policy of insurance.

To the extent permitted by law, County shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Contractor, its agents, officers, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, judgments, liabilities, expenses, and other costs, including litigation costs and attorney's fees, arising out of, or resulting from, the active negligence, or wrongful acts of County, its officers, or employees.

14. RECORDS AND AUDIT.

A. Records. Contractor shall prepare and maintain all records required by the various provisions of this Agreement, federal, state, county, municipal, ordinances, regulations, and directions.

Contractor shall maintain these records for a minimum of four (4) years from the termination or completion of this Agreement. Contractor may fulfill its obligation to maintain records as required by this paragraph by substitute photographs, microphotographs, or other authentic reproduction of such records.

B. Inspections and Audits. Any authorized representative of County shall have access to any books, documents, papers, records, including, but not limited to, financial records of Contractor, which are not otherwise legally privileged information, and which County determines to be pertinent to this Agreement, for the purposes of making audit, evaluation, examination, excerpts, and transcripts during the period such records are to be maintained by Contractor. Further, County has the right, at all reasonable times, to audit, inspect, or otherwise evaluate the work performed or being performed under this Agreement.

C. Workload Data. Contractor shall promptly provide to County any and all workload or case data, which is not otherwise legally privileged information, upon the written request of either the County Administrator or the County Board of Supervisors.

15. NONDISCRIMINATION.

During the performance of this Agreement, Contractor, his/her agents, officers, and employees shall not unlawfully discriminate in violation of any federal, state, or local law, against any employee, or applicant for employment, or person receiving services under this Agreement, because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, age, or sex. Contractor and his/her agents, officers, and employees shall comply with the provisions of the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code section 12900, et seq.), and the applicable regulations promulgated thereunder in the California Code of Regulations. Contractor shall also abide by the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352) and all amendments thereto, and all administrative rules and regulations issued pursuant to said act.

16. CANCELLATION.

This Agreement may be canceled by County without cause, and at will, for any reason by giving to Contractor sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel. Contractor may cancel this Agreement without cause, and at will, for any reason whatsoever by giving sixty (60) days written notice of such intent to cancel to County.

17. TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

Upon the termination of this Agreement or any extension thereof, County shall pay Contractor such compensation due, if any, prorated to the date of termination; and Contractor shall deliver all active and inactive case files to the person or office as the County Administrator shall designate in writing.

18. TERMINATION OF PREVIOUS AGREEMENT.

Contractor agrees that upon the execution of this Agreement by the parties hereto, any prior written Agreement for the provision of professional services as a Public Defender for the County of Inyo shall be terminated, and the consideration for the continued representation of clients in the courts of the County of Inyo shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement as of the effective date of this Agreement. It is further understood between the parties hereto that there are no oral agreements or representations between the parties affecting this Agreement and that this Agreement supersedes and cancels any and all previous negotiations, arrangements, agreements and understandings, if any, and none thereof shall be used to interpret or construe this Agreement.

19. ASSIGNMENT.

This is an agreement for the services of Contractor. County has relied upon the skills, knowledge, experience, and training of Contractor as an inducement to enter into this Agreement. Contractor shall not assign or subcontract this Agreement, or any part of it, without the express written consent of County.

Further, Contractor shall not assign any monies due or to become due under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County.

20. DEFAULT.

If the Contractor abandons the work, or fails to proceed with the work and services requested by County in a timely manner, or fails in any way as required to conduct the work and services as required by County, County may declare the Contractor in default and terminate this Agreement upon five (5) days written notice to Contractor.

21. WAIVER OF DEFAULT.

Waiver of any default by either party to this Agreement shall not be deemed to be waiver of any subsequent default. Waiver or breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed to be a waiver of any other or subsequent breach, and shall not be construed to be a modification of the terms of this Agreement unless this Agreement is modified as provided in paragraph twenty-eight (28) below.

22. CONFIDENTIALITY.

Contractor agrees to comply with the various provisions of the federal, state, and county laws, regulations, and ordinances providing that information and records kept, maintained, or accessible by Contractor in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, shall be privileged, restricted, or confidential. Contractor agrees to keep confidential all such information and records. Disclosure of such confidential, privileged, or protected information shall be made by Contractor only in compliance with law..

23. CONFLICTS.

Contractor agrees that he/she has no interest, and shall not acquire any interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with Contractor's performance of the work and services under this Agreement. Specifically, Contractor agrees not to engage in any private legal representations of any matter which would conflict or interfere with Contractor's ability to represent clients under this Agreement. Additionally, Contractor, during the term of this Agreement agrees not to advise or represent any person , corporation or entity with a claim or cause of action against the County of Inyo, its officers, agents, or employees.

24. POST AGREEMENT COVENANT.

Contractor agrees not to use any confidential, protected, or privileged information which is gained in the course of providing services and work under this Agreement, for any personal benefit, gain, or enhancement.

25. SEVERABILITY.

If any portion of this Agreement or application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, or if it is found in contravention of any federal, state, or county statute, ordinance, or regulation, the remaining provisions of this Agreement, or the application thereof, shall not be invalidated thereby, and shall remain in full force and effect to the extent that the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

26. FUNDING LIMITATION.

The ability of County to enter this Agreement is based upon available funding from various sources. In the event that such funding fails, is reduced, or is modified, from one or more sources, County has the option to cancel, reduce, or modify this Agreement, or any of its terms within ten (10) days of its notifying Contractor of the cancellation, reduction, or modification of available funding. Any reduction or modification

of this Agreement made pursuant to this provision must comply with the requirements of paragraph twenty-eight (28) (Amendment).

27. ATTORNEY'S FEES.

If either of the parties hereto brings an action or proceeding against the other, including, but not limited to, an action to enforce or declare the cancellation, termination, or revision of the Agreement, the prevailing party in such action or proceeding shall be entitled to receive from the other party all reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred in connection therewith.

28. RENEGOTIATION.

Either the County or the Contractor may, upon sixty (60) days written notice, initiate renegotiation of the Scope of Work (Attachment A and A-1) and Schedule of Fees (Attachment B). If as a result of renegotiations, both parties agree to modify the Scope of Work and Schedule of Fees, such modification must comply with the requirements of paragraph twenty-nine (29) (Amendment).

29. AMENDMENT.

This Agreement may be modified, amended, changed, added to, or subtracted from, by the mutual consent of the parties hereto, if such amendment or change is in written form and executed with the same formalities as this Agreement, and attached to the original Agreement to maintain continuity.

30. NOTICE.

Any notice, communication, amendments, additions, or deletions to this Agreement, including change of address of either party during the terms of this Agreement, which Contractor or County shall be required, or may desire, to make, shall be in writing and may be personally served, or sent by prepaid first class mail to, the respective parties as follows:

SCOPE OF WORK:

1. PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES.

A. **WARRANTY.** Contractor warrants that he/she has read and reviewed the contracts of all the other attorneys engaged by the County to provide professional services as public defenders (hereinafter referred to as "Contract Public Defenders") during the term of this Agreement. Such Agreements are by reference incorporated herein as though set forth in full. Contractor agrees and understands that he/she shall consult, confer, and agree with all the other Contract Public Defenders to, and shall provide legal representation and substitute handling and coverage of Contract Public Defender cases as required by the provisions below. Contractor agrees and understands that these provisions are of mutual benefit to Contractor and each of the other Contract Public Defenders, and does not entitle Contractor to any additional compensation under this Agreement.

B. DEFINITIONS.

1. "Attorney-Conflict of Interest" cases are those that would be within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender but for an attorney-client conflict of interest of that public defender. Attorney-client conflicts are those that are defined and recognized by applicable law.
2. "Time Conflict" cases are those that are within the primary responsibilities of another Contract Public Defender who is unable to fulfill his/her contractual duties to attend the courts and represent the clients in such cases for whatever reason including, but not limited to vacations, temporary illnesses, conflicting court calendars, or attendance at attorney education courses.

C. **ATTORNEY-CLIENT CONFLICT OF INTEREST CASES.** Except as may be provided in F. below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement, attached hereto and by referenced incorporated herein.

D. **TIME CONFLICT CASES.** Except as may be provided in E and F below, or where Contractor's own attorney-client conflict of interest or time conflict prohibits such, Contractor shall provide substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases in accordance with the Conflicts Coverage Table, Attachment A-1 to this Agreement.

E. **TIME CONFLICT CASES LIMITATION.** Contractor shall provide coverage for time conflict cases for which another Contract Public Defender is primarily responsible but for whatever reason, the duties of such other Contract Public Defender cannot be performed for a period of not more than thirty (30) consecutive calendar days.

F. WAIVER. The requirements for Contractor to handle attorney-client conflict of interest and time conflict cases as required by this Agreement may be waived by the County Administrator where extenuating demands are placed upon Contractor during his/her representation of the following:

1. A defendant charged with a capital or other serious offense in which the death penalty or life imprisonment without possibility of parole is a possible sanction;
2. A minor, who, if charged and tried as an adult, may face the death penalty or life imprisonment without the possibility of parole;
3. A minor or parent(s) on a Writ arising out of a dependency case in which the Contractor represents such minor or parent(s).

During the period of this Agreement, Contractor shall provide legal representation for attorney-client conflict of interest cases, and substitute handling and coverage of court calendars and legal representation in time conflict cases as required by this Agreement, in the following types of cases and in the following priority among other Contract Public Defenders:

Primary Obligations:

First Priority	Misdemeanors, South County
Second Priority	Delinquency Cases
Second Priority	Dependency Cases
Second Priority:	Felony Cases, North and South County
Third Priority	Misemeanors, North County

Secondary Obligations:

All other Conflict matters, including Delinquency, Dependency, Child Support, Mental Health and Conservatorship Cases, Patient Rights Advocate Cases, AB 109 Revocation Hearings and any other matter in which the County is obligated to provide public defender services.

Note: The Table listed above will be followed for the majority of the cases assigned to this Public Defender. However, a Judge, when assigning a case, will consider the experience, caseload, complexity of the case and prior representation of the same client, which may result in a Public Defender assigned a case out of the listed sequence. In addition, the County reserves the right to modify the conflicts coverage table as necessary to make consistent with other Public Defender contracts as they may be amended and as necessary to address legislative changes which may impact the County's obligation to provide Public Defender services.

1. COMPENSATION:

County shall pay to Contractor on or before the first (1st) day of each month during the term of the Agreement, the amount set forth below as full and complete compensation for Contractor's performance of all of the work and services required to be performed during that month by Contractor:

- A. From August ~~July 1, 2012~~ through June 30, 2013: ~~\$110,000.00~~ Annual; \$9,166.66/mo. 100,833.26 (11 mos.)
- B. From July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015, upon exercise of option:
\$120,000.00 Annual; \$10,000.00/mo.

2. INCIDENTAL EXPENSES:

A. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provision of Sections 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized professional services required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person which Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Professional services shall include, but not be limited to, investigators, photographers, accident reconstruction experts, chemists, criminalists, psychologists, psychiatrists, physicians, and other legal counsel with specialized expertise. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for professional services, received written authorization for Contractor to engage the providers of specific professional services from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve engaging each provider of professional services as well as the amount of any fees, costs, and other expenses for such services. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for the expenses of professional services which are either in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge.

B. County will reimburse Contractor in accordance with the provisions of Section 3C. and 3F. of this Agreement, for the actual cost of authorized document photocopying which is in excess of 5,000 pages in any single case, and which is required to provide an adequate and competent defense and representation of a person whom Contractor is required by this Agreement to represent. Contractor shall on a case by case basis, and prior to incurring any expense for reimbursable photocopying, provide documentation to the County that Contractor has at his/her own expense made 5,000 copies of documents in a single case, and received written authorization for Contractor to incur reimbursable photocopying expenses from the Judge assigned to the case. Such authorization shall specifically approve incurring expenses for photocopies in excess of 5,000 pages, shall set forth the number of additional pages authorized to be copied, and the authorized cost of such copying. County reserves the right to deny reimbursement to Contractor for copying expenses which are in excess of Contractor's actual costs, or the amount authorized by the Judge, or which were incurred by Contractor without the prior authorization of the assigned Judge, or which were incurred by the Contractor in making the first 5,000 photocopy pages in any single case.
