# RESPONSE:

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Defendants object to this request on the grounds that it calls for a legal conclusion.

Notwithstanding and without waiving the foregoing objection, Defendants respond that, as stated in the response to Request for Admission No. 31, a portion of the claimed Padre Point Road is excluded from wilderness designation. The NPS is in the process of preparing final wilderness boundary maps, and the NPS intends that the final maps will exclude the remaining portion of the claimed Padre Point Road from wilderness. The NPS derives the authority to prepare final wilderness maps from the Park's enabling legislation, 16 U.S.C. Section 410aaa-3 (P.L. 103-433, Title III, Section 304), and the CDPA, P.L. 103-433, Title VI, Section 602.

<u>Last Chance Road/South end:</u> A carsonite post was installed in approximately 1995. A "wilderness restoration" barrier was installed in approximately 2000.

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<u>Last Chance Road/North end:</u> A carsonite post was installed in approximately 1995.
<u>Petro Road/Southwest end:</u> A carsonite post was installed in approximately 1995. A
"wilderness restoration" barrier was installed in 1998.

<u>Petro Road/Northeast end:</u> A carsonite post was installed in approximately 1995. A "no vehicles" sign was installed in approximately 2000. A "wilderness restoration" barrier was installed in the summer of 2006.

Lost Section Road - South/North end: Two carsonite posts were installed in 2005.

Lost Section Road - South/South end: A "wilderness restoration" barrier was installed in late 2004.

## INTERROGATORY NO. 6:

County personnel observed what appears to be a circular saw cut around a sheep petroglyph at the southwesterly terminus of Greenwater Canyon. Defendants object to this request on the grounds that it calls for irrelevant information not reasonably calculated to lead to the discovery of admissible evidence. Notwithstanding and without waiving the foregoing objection, Defendants respond that the NPS has copies of photographs from 1963 showing the petroglyphs intact, and copies of photographs taken in 1982 which show the referenced marks. Defendants did not reach any conclusions about when or by what means the damage was done and no arrests were made.
