- 19 confirmed COVID-19 cases | 1 death | 15 recovered

#### **Inyo County Testing:**

- Tests Administered: 395
- Tests Positive: 19
- Tests Negative: 362
- Tests Pending\*: 14

*\*Cases with pending results are monitored by medical staff ordering test; Inyo County Public Health monitors pending results identified as high probability individuals.*

- **CRITICAL REMINDER -** Health Officer Orders pertaining to quarantine and self-isolation, prohibition of certain short-term rentals, use of masks in residential facilities, and use of masks by the general public REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT to support Inyo County’s ability to attest to the California Department of Public Health that we meet the requirements to move through Stage 2 of the re-opening plan at our own pace. Without these orders, we are unable to demonstrate our ability to mitigate risk and meet one of the many metrics required for counties to advance at their own pace. **Failure to comply with Health Officer Orders places individuals and our community at increased risk of infection. Violation of Health Officer Orders may also result in a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment, fine, or both (Health and Safety Code §120295).**
